MATERIALS REQUIRED:

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

PowerPoint presentation

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Welcome all Children. Introduce the teachers and other resource personnel. General safety/COVID restriction rules if any Children to report any concerns to the teachers' housekeeping requirements. Start with Solemn Cross — check how many know how to do it and those who don't. Introducing the term 'Virtues'. Talk to them how virtues are classified as Cardinal virtues and Theological virtues. Kids watch a PowerPoint presentation explaining the different Cardinal and Theological virtues. They should also learn why theological virtues are different from cardinal virtues. Theological virtues differ from the cardinal virtues in that they cannot be obtained by human effort but are infused by God into a person. Kids to watch the video on Theological virtues.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

Kids learn about the difference between cardinal virtues and theological virtues. They learn the 3 theological virtues are Faith, Hope and Charity.

ICEBREAKER - TEAM JIGSAW PUZZLE GAME


Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 25 Minutes

MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Pictures of saints cut down as puzzles



PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Separate people into same sized teams. Give each a different saint's jigsaw puzzle (with equal difficulty & number of pieces). Each group has the same amount of time to complete the puzzle.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Each group is given the same amount of time to complete the puzzle. The secret twist is to switch up a few pieces with the other groups beforehand!

The goal is to finish before the others - so they must figure out collectively how to convince other teams to give up pieces they need. This can be through barter, merging or changing teams.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

Kids learn about saints and a virtue they practiced.

ACTIVITY 1 - BLINDFOLDED CHALLENGE

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 15 Minutes

MATERIALS REQUIRED:

A brave child, Blindfold, Chair

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Find a helper in your class and bring them to the front. I'd suggest asking for someone that is 'brave'. You don't want someone shy to help you with this. Have them stand to one side of you and pull out a blindfold that the kids haven't seen before. (It works well to not let them anticipate what is going to happen). Explain to the class that you are demonstrating what faith is like. Faith is not being able to see (like your helper can't see). Faith is listening to God and trusting Him that He will help you and lead you where you should go.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

This is what you are going to do with your helper, who is now blindfolded.

First, spin them around a few times so that they are now disoriented and don't know which way is safe to walk. Then, give the blindfolded kid instructions where to walk as she makes her way across the room. Give her instructions every once in a while, so it looks like she might run into something, but when she gets close have her turn and avoid running into anything. The object here is to have everybody watching a little worried whether or not your helper is going to make it without falling down or running into something.

As your helper nears the other side of the room tell her that when you give the command you want her to sit down. She is not allowed to feel if there is anything to sit on, she just has to have faith and sit down. As you are explaining this very quietly bring out a chair or stool and position it so she will be able to sit in it. Cue your audience not to make any noise. Remember, when your helper started there was no chair to sit, she doesn't know if there will be a chair when she sits down. Lastly tell your helper to sit down. When she is safely seated in the chair take off the blindfold and have everyone give her a big hand.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

Faith, hope, and love are called theological—or basic—virtues because so many other virtues depend on them. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that "the theological virtues ... are infused by God into the souls of the faithful to make them capable of acting as his children and of meriting eternal life. Faith, hope, and love are gifts flowing from God's love for us. We can't create or obtain them on our own, but they do depend on our openness and our readiness to choose them and say, "yes" to them. We have to be open to receive and then exercise faith to keep it strong and growing. Jesus said he could not heal or perform miracles in certain places because of the lack of faith he found there. However, some of his miracles happened because ordinary people like you or I had faith. These gifts of God work together in a circuit in which each helps and supports the other. Faith in God helps hope to grow, and faith and hope help overcome fears. Then we become free to let God's love flow through us to others.

ACTIVITY 2 - SPEND TIME WITH SAINTS

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 40 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Printed copy of Life story of Saints, Completed Jigsaw puzzle of the saints.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Children to be in groups of 10 and each group is allocated a teacher.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Teacher allocated for each group, read the life story of Saint to the Children. Have a group discussion about the ways how that Saint grow in faith. A simple Role play prepared by each group about the life of saint. All groups come together and perform the Role play. 3 children from each group explain about the deeds, actions or life habits of Saints which helped the saint to grow in Faith.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

Saints were ordinary people like any of us but they grow in Faith and holiness by Trusting in God and living a life the way God wants them to live. Life of saints are model for us to grow in Faith and to deepen Faith.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

One person in each group will hold an umbrella and the there is an extra person outside. When you say "Go", a child will race to touch the extra child in the group. Before they could touch, they should split and rearrange. If they get caught, that person will be out. The game will continue until 5 kids remain.

ACTIVITY 4 - SCRIPTURE READING AND DISCUSSION

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 15 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Copies of Psalm 91:1-8 God is our Protector

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

A printed copy of Psalms given to every child

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Discuss God's protection. Discuss with students, what are some earthly objects that protect us from harm (shields, structures, other people, etc.)? We certainly understand the need for physical protection from things such as the weather, sickness, and even invading armies. But how is our need for physical protection related to our even greater need for spiritual protection? Today we will learn how, and why, God protects us from Satan and the evil of this world.

Discussion Questions: (Kids divided to group of 5 or 6)

- 1 What does God's "shadow" give us? (Shelter and rest.)
- 2 Do we need to be near or far from God to be in His shadow? (Near.)
- 3 How do we stay near to Him? (Through obedience, prayer, studying His word, etc.)
- 4 How does God "shelter," or protect us, from evil? (He saves us from Satan's deliberate attacks, death, our fears, sickness, punishment, etc.)
- 5 What animal is used to compare God's protection? (A bird, verse 4 "He will cover you with His feathers.")
- 6 How is this an accurate description of God's desire to protect us? (Because a mother bird will use her wings to shield her young from danger.)
- 7 So, how is God a Mighty Fortress for us? (Because when we know God and draw near to Him, He will protect us like a fortress protects the people inside.)
- 8 Why does He protect us? (Because of His great love!)

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

We are under God's protection wherever we are. We don't have to be too much worried about the changing situations. We can trust His ability to provide us safety from evil.

ACTIVITY 5 - CATCH ME IF YOU CAN!

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 30 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Bucket, one tennis ball, and scarf for blindfold.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Choose 2-3 kids from each group to demonstrate the activity

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

This activity will be conducted as 3 parts.

Part 1 - Place the bucket at 3 or 4 or 5meter distance and ask the child to throw the tennis ball into the bucket, provide 3 tries, the child should be able to throw the ball in the bucket. After each attempt the teacher will give some support to guide the child how to position / throw so that he / she can throw the ball into the bucket.

Part 2 - Place the bucket at 2-meter distance and ask the child turn around bend and throw the ball into the bucket. Provide trial runs for the child to throw the ball into the bucket. After each attempt the teacher will give some support to guide the child how to position / throw so that he / she can throw the ball into the bucket.

Part 3 - Place the bucket at 2-meter distance and blind fold the child with the scarf and ask the child to throw the ball in the bucket. Provide trial runs for the child to throw the ball into the bucket without the blindfold. After each attempt the teacher will give some support to guide the child how to position / throw so that he / she can throw the ball into the bucket.

Our first attempts may not succeed but if we listen to the instructions carefully their attempts will be successful.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

Scenario of Part 1: Situations in life which you know are difficult and know that it is temporary. Examples – when you get hurt badly, by falling down, or your parents are sick.

Scenario of Part 2: Situations in life which you know are difficult, partly you know what will happen and part of it is not knowing what will happen next. Examples: Moved to a new place you miss your friends in school and neighbours and our in a new school and new neighbours, new house.

Scenario of Part 3: Situations in life where you don't know what will happen. Examples: unable to understand certain subjects, Maths, Science, I don't know what will happen when I grow up.



HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Welcome all Children. Introduce the teachers and other resource personnel. Remind the General safety/COVID restriction rules if any Children to report any concerns to the teachers' housekeeping requirements.

Start with Solemn Cross – check how many know how to do it and those who don't. The PowerPoint explains what Ecclesia means and how Family is the basic ecclesia. Ecclesia (or Ekklesia) means a particular body of faithful people, More commonly it means "the Assembly or Congregation or Council". The term Ecclesia refers to church itself and Church Refers to the universal community of believers.

According to Pope Francis there are four essential characteristics of ecclesial life: listening to the apostles' teaching, first; second, the safeguarding of mutual communion; third, the breaking of the bread; and fourth, prayer. The Church's existence has meaning if it remains firmly united to Christ, that is, in community, in His Word, in the Eucharist and in prayer – the way we unite ourselves to Christ.



The ecclesia is made up of families. In a world often alien and even hostile to faith, believing families are of primary importance as centers of living, radiant faith. For this reason, the Second Vatican Council, using an ancient expression, calls the family the Ecclesia domestica. 168 It is in the bosom of the family that parents are "by word and example . . . the first heralds of the faith with regard to their children. They should encourage them in the vocation, which is proper to each child, fostering with special care any religious vocation."

Thus, the home is the first school of Christian life and "a school for human enrichment. This is where a child should learn endurance and the joy of work, fraternal love, generous - even repeated - forgiveness, and above all divine worship in prayer and the offering of one's life.

For ecclesial living families should practice the following:

- 1. Families should pray together, Parents should read Bible stories to their children, discuss homilies on the way home from mass.
- 2. Families go to the sacraments and parents take their children to the sacraments
- 3. There should be ongoing practice of reconciliation in the home because all families are imperfect.





The Christian home is the place where children receive the first proclamation of the faith. For this reason, the family home is rightly called "the domestic church," a community of grace and prayer, a school of human virtues and of Christian charity.

Domestic Church


- Domestic church = your family; where you are first taught values, rules, to know God, education
- Learn through the love you see in your families

The Gospel values should be embedded into the family values so that it transforms and empowers our families to become domestic Churches. One authentic way of achieving this is by assisting these families to develop and grow in faith which is embedded in cultural and Gospel values and strengthened by ardent prayers. Helping families develop this way is a vital way of integrating the families to the parish and ultimately developing and instilling in each person the consciousness of belonging to the Church as a family. So, our families should become opportune places of embedding the Gospel message more concretely in the cultural ambience of Syro Malabar Christian life.

ICEBREAKER - CHURCH BUILDING

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 25 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

55 paper cups.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

The class will be divided in to 6 groups with 10 members in each class. Each group is given 55 plastic cups.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

The teacher has to instruct the students how to play the game. The children should be given 2 minutes to discuss and prepare for the activity. The group has to build a Church with cups with one cup at the top and 10 cups at the bottom. No cups should be left out. The Church should not collapse once it is made. A timer should be run to find out which group builds the Church in the shortest time. The teacher has to observe the group dynamics while the preparation is ongoing, while the Church is being built.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

The Church represents the close-knit family system, the St Thomas Christians (Syro Malabar church members) for generations have maintained a close-knit family system. The importance of family, respect for elders, grandparents, uncles, aunts, God parents, religious people and teachers were given the respect and thus followed a pyramid like hierarchical family system. The extended family/joint family system played a key role in the spiritual nourishment of the family and the younger generations. Obedience, hard work, respect for the elder/God/church/family, perseverance, sacrifice, a sense of belonging is some of the qualities essential for this pyramid style family system to be successful.

ACTIVITY 1 - LONGEST LINE

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 20 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Whistle, timer

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

The children should be given 2 minutes to discuss and prepare for the activity.

No bags or contents of the bag should be used in the game by any student.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

The students are required to build the longest line with articles that they have on them. Example: shoes, belts, scarfs, jackets, socks, or item which with them.

The student themselves can be part of the line. The group which forms the longest line is the winner. The teacher has to observe the group dynamics while the preparation is ongoing, while the longest line is being built.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

The faith of the Syro Malabar community was such that the concept of sharing, alms giving and willingness to provide whatever they had (land, money, resources, talent, laboring) in order to establish, churches, schools, colleges, medical facilities, orphanages, old age homes and a variety of services to the needy is an ingrained quality/trait which has been nourished by faith is one of the greatest qualities of our ecclesia living.

ACTIVITY 2 - MINT RELAY

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 30 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Mints and straws for each group.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

The teacher has to instruct the students how to play the game. The teacher should show how the game has to be played and provide a trial game for the students to practice. The children should be given 2 minutes to discuss and prepare for the activity.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

The students are supposed to stand in a line with straw as given to each participant. The students are required to pass the 2 mints one at a time from the first to the last participant only with the straws. The first participant has to take the mint with the straw from the paper plate, then pass on to the next participant with ends of the straw. If the straw falls down, then the game will have to start over. The mint shall only be lifted with the straw, the fingers or hands should not be used to support the mint while passing from one participant to the next. The group which finishes passing the mint to plate at the end first is the winner.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

The mint represents Regular Sunday observance, holy communion, confessions, obligatory days, family prayers, alms giving, providing contributions as land or money or resources, Voluntary involvement in church activities, constructive engagement within the church community, catechism, etc...) Passing on the same to our children sometimes we fail or falter or don't provide the right spiritual environment for the growth of our children. The Syro Malabar community has a very strong tradition of keeping the above-mentioned activities earnestly as these are basic foundations of the Syro Malabar faith.

ACTIVITY 3 - BALL TOSS

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 15 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

5-6 Balls.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Divide the children equally and have them stand in two lines, facing each other, about 10 feet apart. Each child will need to be facing another child. The children will be tossing a ball back and forth to the person across from them. If you have an odd number of children, the extra child can count the number of successful catches.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Give all the children in the first row, called "Row A", a ball. Instruct the children that on your signal, they will toss the piece of popcorn 10 feet across the aisle to the person directly facing them in "Row B". Instruct the older children to use only one hand to toss or to catch the ball. Tell the kids that the ball in this activity represents our relationship with God. Give the signal or whistle and have the children toss the ball. Many of the tosses will fall short since the children are so far apart. Record the number of successful throws on a chalkboard or whiteboard.

Make sure each child in "Row B" has a ball. Each child in "Row B" will take one-step towards "Row A." Then on your signal, have the children toss the ball again. Once again, record the number of successful throws on a chalkboard or whiteboard. Do this several more times, each time taking one-step closer until the two rows are together. Once together, the children can simply drop the ball into the hands of the other child, resulting in no misses.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

Explain that our relationship with God is similar to what we just did. The further away from each other, the harder it was to catch the ball. Likewise, the further we are from God, the harder it is to have a relationship with God. On the other hand, the closer we are to God, the easier it will be to have a strong relationship with Him.

How do we get close to God?

We can get closer to God by reading the Bible, praying, sacraments and good deeds.

ACTIVITY 4 - S DEMONSTRATION

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 15 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

One small vase. One artificial flower and plant. One fresh cut flower and plant

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Before class, find one artificial flower and one fresh cut flower, and place each in the vase. Fill the vase with water. (Flowers do not need to be the same type, but if they are similar, it will enhance the effect of the lesson.) You will have the children identify the real flower from the fake flower not by sight, but by using their other senses such as smell and touch. In a similar way, we can identify a fake Christian from a genuine Christian. Looks may be deceiving, but there are ways to tell.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Look everyone, I have two beautiful flowers here. Both flowers are beautiful, can you tell any difference between the two flowers? (The kids will most likely be able to see that one of the flowers is not real, some might even say the fake flower is prettier. This is OK.) Both flowers do look pretty. Both are sitting in water and in a vase, but one is not real. I am sure you can tell which flower is fake. Fake Christians are a lot like this fake flower. They may say they are Christians, go to church on Sunday and look like Christians. However, their walk with the Lord is fake or artificial. They do not have a real spiritual life. Let me show you some other ways you can tell the difference between real and fake. Ask a volunteer to come forward, touch the fake tree, and describe how it feels. Then have them touch the petals of the real tree and describe how it feels. Yes, the fake tree is stiff, cannot grow, and remain like that forever. But the real tree grows. It can recieve water, sunlight and grows to bear fruits, give shade to the people, birds can make nests on it. Ask another volunteer to come up and smell the fake flower and describe what he or she smells. Then have them smell the real flower and describe how it smells. Yes, the fake flower has no smell, or perhaps smells like plastic, but the real flower smells good, it has a pleasing aroma. Real Christians are like this real flower, not only do they look like Christians by being at church on Sunday, but the rest of the week they are doing things that please God, and they are a blessing to others. They are not dead but have everlasting life. Now which of these flowers or trees would you rather be?

ACTIVITY 5 - BALLOON RACE

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 20 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Balloons, Baskets for holding Balloons 2.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Maximum number of participants - 10

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Have a starting point and finishing point for the game. Place the inflated balloons on one side and get 5 children at a time to participate in the game. Line 5 children and ask them to pick one balloon at a time and place it in between their legs and walk or hop to the finishing point without dropping or popping the balloons. Whoever collects most number of balloons to the finishing point at a given time, without dropping or popping the balloons wins the game.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

To live a life the way God wants us to live, could be a little hard for us to achieve. But we have to take up the challenge and win the race. To live ecclesial life, we have to choose the right way of living.

Duration: 10 Minutes




MATERIALS REQUIRED:

ACTIVITY 2 - BIBLE TIMELINE

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 15 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

18 Balloons (9 red and 9 blue), Permanent Marker, two 6-foot strings, Books of the Bible Bookmark Click here, adult assistant.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Blow up all 18 balloons and knot-tie them closed. Do not blow up the balloons to the point of popping; rather, leave some expansion room within, so that the balloons won't pop as easily when the players roll them across the floor.

With permanent marker, print one category below per red balloon. Repeat the process for the blue balloons. Law (OT), Major Prophet (OT), History (NT).

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Divide children into two teams, each containing an adult leader. Before starting the game, leaders will hand out the Bible bookmarks and spend several minutes reviewing the books under each category with their team. Teams line up single file behind the first string. The string on the opposite side of the room is the finish line. Tell the children that they will be using just their feet to roll the balloon across the floor towards the finish line.

Leader #1 hands each member of "Team One" a red balloon and Leader #2 hands each member of "Team Two" a blue balloon, in random order. After handing out the balloons, both leaders position themselves at the finish line. When one leader says, "Bible Balloon Race," the first player from each team sets his or her balloon on the floor and begins to maneuver it towards the finish line. Once a player's balloon crosses the finish line, he or she must show the category printed on the balloon to his or her leader then name one book of the Bible from that category. If the player answers correctly, his or her team receives one point. If the answer is incorrect, no points are awarded. Either way, the next player on the respective team should begin moving his or her balloon to the finish line. If a player accidently pops a balloon, no points are awarded and the next player on the team begins immediately. If teams are uneven, a child from the team with fewer players will need to play twice.

The team that finishes with the most points win the game or if both teams have equal points, the first team to finish wins the game.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

This game intends that the kids learn the different books in the bible and the basis on which they are categorised. Kids are also given the message.

ACTIVITY 3 - OLD TELEPHONE GAME

Age Category: 9-12 Years

Duration: 15 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Bible passages.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Children in groups of 10 to stand in either a line or a circle. Players should be spaced far enough apart that they won't overhear the word when it isn't their turn.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Choose a person to start the game. This person will think of a word and whisper it to the person next to them. The word should be an uncommon one as the idea is to see how much it changes by the game's end. Once the word has been told to the next person, they will whisper it to the person next to them.

Players continue listening to the word and repeating what they think they heard to the person next to them. This is done until the last person in the line or circle is told the word.

Once the last person hears the word or phrase, they will say what they think they heard out-loud. This is compared to the original word that the game started with. This is the moment when all the players get to learn just how much the word or phrase changed through their "telephone line".

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

The old telephone game to show how difficult it would be for the people who wrote the different books of the Bible to do so from memory with such accuracy. It would be impossible without the help of the Holy Spirit.

Look up some scriptures that may help us understand the significance and truth about the Bible. Help the children find the following verses and have someone read each one. Then discuss each verse.

Verses and Discussion Questions:

2 Timothy 3:16-17

- 1. Where does all Scripture come from? (From God.)
- 2. What is Scripture good for? (Teaching, rebuking, correcting, training and equipping.)

2 Peter 1:20-21

- 1. Does Scripture come from the will of man? (No, from the Will of God.)
- 2. Who "inspired" or "carried" men to write the Bible? (The Holy Spirit.)

Psalm 12:6

- 1. Does the Bible contain any mistakes? (No, it is flawless.)
- 2. What does "pure" gold or silver mean? (Without any impurities.)

Psalm 119:160

- 1. How can you respond to someone who says the Bible isn't true? (All of God's words are true, so the Bible is also true because it is the Word of God.)
- 2. Does God ever need to come up with new rules or laws? (No, His laws are eternal.)

1. Why is it difficult for some people to understand the Bible? (Because they do not have the Holy Spirit to guide them.)

How does God reveal the Bible to us? (By the Holy Spirit.)

Children will be given a set of bible passages to memorise on the first day of the fest.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

The game start with one student passing the ball to another and the student catching the ball has to say the word of God. This repeats till all members of the team have had a chance to pass the ball and say a bible verse.

How is that even possible? Let's investigate today.

Theme Presentation	00:15	We just learned today that our Lord is our strength and our shield. When we trust in Him, we are helped. If you think about it, shields are only needed for battle, wars, and enemies. God never said that things in our lives would be easy. But He did say that He would never leave us alone, He would fight for us, and He would protect us as a shield so that we are helped. Moving from fear to faith Even though this message appears hundreds of times in the Bible, we frequently brush it off as being impractical. Instead, we become so overwhelmed with the daily challenges of life that we abandon all hope of finding peace. Worrying is a regular part of life for many. We may not realize it, but fear can be a great blessing. Not only does it remind us that we need the Lord's help, but it can actually draw us closer to him and give us the peace we seek. The key is to learn how to react when we're afraid. Here are a few simple (but effective) steps that will help you to make the journey from fear to faith.



- Do what you can
- · Live in the moment
- Pray
- Read Bible daily
- · Receive the Sacraments
- Step out in faith
- DO WHAT YOU CAN- Unfortunately, worrying is often our standard response to frightening situations. God gave us an intellect, and he expects us to use it. (Ex: the boy with five loaves and two fish)

Instead of worrying about a troubling situation, ask ourselves a simple question: "Is there anything I can do to fix this?" If you're concerned about a subject in school, you can look for options to learn it by asking the teacher or referring to books or videos. Instead of worrying about your health, consider choosing a healthy diet. Doing what you can (no matter how small) will often be enough to solve (or reduce) the problem and restore your peace of mind.

Acting in the face of fear will help to build our courage. The choice is always ours. And the choice we make will determine whether we grow spiritually and psychologically—or stagnate.

2. LIVE IN THE MOMENT- Living in the present moment can be challenging, but it's something we must learn to do. Time spent worrying about the future or regretting the past is wasted and robs us of God's presence today. The past is gone, and the future is not guaranteed. One of Satan's favourite tactics is planting "what if" and "if only" thoughts in our brain. Don't fall for his lies.

Jesus warned against worrying about tomorrow (see Matthew 6:34) or dwelling on the past (see Luke 9:62) for a reason. Doing either of these activities is a waste of time and a sure cause of anxiety. If there is something we can do today to correct a past mistake or prepare for the future, do it. Otherwise, keep our eyes on the Lord and focus on following him in the present moment. He is with us!

3. PRAY- We can be in such a rush to fix our problems that we forget to pray. Without the Lord's help, however, we'll always be spinning our wheels and accomplishing nothing. He never intended us to go through life alone, but he also won't force himself on us. It sounds so basic, but those of us who are anxious frequently forget this step.

No matter what problem or crisis we are facing, always remember to ask the Lord for help. We will be amazed at how he can do the impossible. There is also another often-overlooked benefit to praying instead of panicking. According to St. Paul, bringing our intentions to God (see Philippians 4:6-7) will result in the peace that "surpasses all understanding." That is a sweet deal!

4. READ BIBLE DAILY- If we open up our Bible, we'll see many examples of individuals who trusted God even when it didn't make sense. Abraham, Moses, Mary, St. Paul and many others trusted in the Lord's plan, even though they didn't have all the details. We can learn a lot from their example. In addition,



		reading the Bible allows God to speak to us. His words will not only bring us comfort, but they will give us direction. 5. RECEIVE THE SACRAMENTS- One of the best ways to boost our faith is to frequently receive the sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation. We will be flooded with graces that will increase our faith in ways we never thought possible. 6. STEP OUT IN FAITH- While this may sound like the craziest of all the steps, it's often the most effective. When we say," OK Lord, I'm going to trust you" and give Him the chance to deliver, we'll often be rewarded with increased faith. Eventually, we'll find ourselves trusting Him more and more. As a result, we'll be able to accomplish great things. So, go aheaddon't be afraid to take the first step! Many of us have gotten so used to living with anxiety that we sometimes forget that there is an answer. As we've discovered, our fears will fade as our faith increases. If you're tired of living in fear, try out these steps and see what happens. The only thing we have to lose is our anxiety!

ICEBREAKER - TRUST TOSS GAME

Age Category: 10+

Duration: 10 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Ball

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

None.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Show the students Psalm 28:7a. Read the verse. Have them repeat it after you. Practice a couple of times, using motions. Post it up so that it is visible for the game.

"The LORD is my strength and my shield; my heart trusts in him, and I am helped." - Psalm 28:7a

Let the students make a large circle. The first student to receive the ball should say the verse and toss it to a friend. That friend will catch the ball, repeat the verse, and toss it to someone who hasn't had it yet. Have them continue tossing and repeating the verse until everyone has had a turn. Time them and see how quickly the Trust Toss can make its rounds. If time allows, play again, and try to beat your time.

ACTIVITY - ARMOR OF GOD

Age Category: 10+

Duration: 10 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

List of challenges, Mobile phone.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Create a list of challenges. Ensure that phones are used only for the activity and kept away during the rest of the sessions.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Divide students into 3 to 4 groups. Each group will need a mobile phone for the game. Have a copy of this list of challenges on hand:

- Text a family member, "I love you." The first team to get a reply and read it out loud will get a point.
- Take a picture of your entire group pretending to fly. The first person to take the photo, run up front and show it to me will get a point.
- Create a slow-motion video of your group that isn't actually in slow motion. The first team to create the video, run up front and show it to me will get a point.
- Look up this verse in the Bible. The first team to find it and read it out loud will win a point: Ephesians 6:11 (*Put on all of God's Armor so that you will be able to stand firm against all strategies of the devil.*)
- Make a paper plane and show it flying to the teacher.
- Take a picture of a team member doing an act of faith.
- If any of the team members have got a Bible with them, they will get an additional point.

The team with the highest points will be the winners.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

Say: I'm so glad all of you got dressed before you came today. Most of us could never imagine leaving our homes without being fully clothed.

Ask: I'm going to ask a silly question: Why do we wear clothing? I'm expecting your answers to be appropriate for our group.

Allow a few responses from students

Clothes protect us from the effects of weather—hot and cold temperatures.

We wear clothes to look good; it's part of how our culture expresses themselves.

And mostly, we don't want to walk around naked—I know I don't!

As followers of Jesus, we clothe ourselves with other things besides jeans and t-shirts.

And even though we're talking about wearing spiritual clothing we physically can't see, it's pretty evident to those around us whether or not we are clothed. Read Ephesians 6:11.

"Put on all of God's Armor so that you will be able to stand firm against all strategies of the devil."





Let's take a look at what this Scripture is talking about. In this verse, Paul tells us to "put on all of God's armor." We understand that battle armor is meant to protect someone when they are in combat or fighting in a war. Throughout history, armor has traditionally been made of metal, iron, leather, or some other type of weapon-resistant material. If a soldier went into battle only wearing parts of their armor, it would be ineffective because the enemy would see the vulnerable parts that weren't protected and target those areas.

Just like your friends would tell you if you were half-dressed, a fellow soldier would most likely say, "Hey! You forgot to put on your helmet." Or "Where is your shield?"

Why? Because they wouldn't want another soldier to get hurt.

Ask: So, what is the "armor of God?"

Obviously, it's not something we physically wear, so what is it?

Allow a few responses from students. In the verses that come before the one we read, the Apostle Paul talks about the **Sword of the Spirit**, **Helmet of Salvation**, **Shield of Faith**, **Breastplate of Righteousness**, **Belt of Truth**, and more. These are the pieces of spiritual armor we wear as Christians. We wear them by reading the Bible, praying, allowing our faith in God to grow, living God-honoring lives, etc.

Every piece of the armor is essential. The Belt of Truth stands for God's truth, and knowing God's truth protects us from the lies of the world and the devil. The scripture says that the armor helps us to stand firm and not waver or be shaken in our faith, no matter what type of battle we face.

Ask: It also says that it helps us to stand firm against the "strategies of the devil."

What are the strategies of the devil? Allow a few responses from students.

God does not want you to be defeated in your walk with Him, but it's your choice of whether or not you go "to battle" in His strength and protection or try to do it on your own. Without God's protection, you will lose every time because we were never meant to live in our own strength. When you put on the armor of God, you are completely covered with everything God knows you need to fight against the devil. And when you see a fellow "soldier" without some of their armor, you should remind them to put it on. If you go to school tomorrow and see someone telling lies or listening to gossip about someone, you can say, "Hey! You're not wearing your armor." When we participate in lying or even listening to lies, we have just made ourselves vulnerable to attacks from the devil.

How?

Because those actions do not demonstrate a desire to stand firm in God's Truth. Instead, you are willing to settle for the lies of the enemy. So, today, I want you to choose to wear the armor of God—and don't just put part of it on and walk around half-dressed but ask God to give you everything you need to stand firm in who He has called you to be.

Get dressed. Stand firm. Fight!

Instead of despairing when he encountered trials, Paul said he would glory in his infirmities so that the power of Christ would rest upon him. (See II Corinthians 12:9.) As we, like Paul, choose to trust God and accept the grace He gives us, Christ's character will be formed in us. "We glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; and patience, experience; and experience, hope: and hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us" (Romans 5:3–5). Unless you accept God's grace to deal with suffering, inevitably	



Lord. (See II Corinthians 5:7, Ephesians 4:31, Hebrews 12:14–15, and II Peter 3:18.)

You can be confident that God will not allow anything to happen to you without His permission, and He will not let any "bad thing" happen that will not ultimately bring you more good than destruction. (See I Peter 4:12–13, Romans 9:14–24, Isaiah 55:8–9, Job 1:6–12, Genesis 50:20, and Psalm 121.) How can we take advantage of these opportunities to mature

How can we take advantage of these opportunities to mature spiritually? The following five responses are keys to enduring tests and trials through God's grace:

1. GIVE THANKS.

Sometimes being thankful in a difficult situation is the most difficult thing you can do. Yet, Scripture is very clear about this response: "In everything give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you" (I Thessalonians 5:18). To be thankful rather than to complain takes a conscious act of the will and a sacrifice of natural desires. Psalm 107:22 appropriately speaks of this choice in terms of a sacrifice: "Let them sacrifice the sacrifices of thanksgiving and declare his works with rejoicing."

Unfortunately, most of us respond with murmuring or complaining when we face hardship of any kind—emotional, spiritual, mental, or physical. However, through trials, "it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure. Do all things without murmurings and disputings: that ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world" (Philippians 2:13–15).

Thanking God in all things does not mean that we thank God for evil. It means that we are thanking God for the benefits He intends for us when He allows things to happen.

2. REJOICE!

Along with giving thanks, we also are instructed to rejoice in all things: "Rejoice in the Lord always: and again I say, Rejoice" (Philippians 4:4). Thanking God is an act of the will, but rejoicing is a response of the spirit. Therefore, it is possible to be sad and joyful at the same time. We cannot escape the pain of a difficult situation, but we can learn to rejoice in God Himself and in the good things God will do through our suffering.

We should try to discern the positive benefits that could come about through the situation. Ask the question, why did God allow this to happen? Tests and trials give us opportunities to come to know God better and to bring glory to God.

The Apostle Paul stated: "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God. . . . We are the children of God: and if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together. For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Romans 8:14–18).



When you experience a trial, choose—by faith—to put your trust in God. This choice will help you be more objective and consequently more alert to the reasons why God may have allowed the trial to occur. As you deal with the difficulties, remember the following truths:

- Gaining intimate knowledge of Christ exceeds the value of gaining more possessions. (See Philippians 3:8.)
- Developing stronger character is more important than getting your own way. (See Hebrews 5:8.)
- Demonstrating self-control is more heroic than dominating your competitors. (See Proverbs 25:28.)
- Eternal treasures are more valuable than earthly riches. (See Matthew 19:21.)

3. BELIEVE AND ACT ON THE WORD OF GOD.

When Jesus was tested in the wilderness, He responded to each temptation by quoting Scripture. For example, when Satan urged Christ to turn stones into bread, Jesus quoted from Deuteronomy 8:3: "It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4). We can follow Jesus' example and successfully engage in spiritual warfare by proclaiming truth in the face of tests and temptations.

Ephesians 6:17 describes the Word of God as "the sword of the Spirit"—the only offensive weapon in our spiritual armor. Jesus said, "The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life" (John 6:63). They are also the authority by which we can claim the promises of God, since we are told, "If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you" (John 15:7).

As you meditate on the truth of God's Word, which is living and active (see Hebrews 4:12), you can learn to **effectively battle the enemy of your soul**, Satan, with the sword of the Spirit.

4. CRY OUT TO GOD.

Perhaps the greatest reason God has for taking us through the trials of life is to bring us to the firm conclusion that we need God. What is God's purpose in giving us commands that seem impossible to carry out? He desires to work powerfully through our lives; therefore, we must learn to depend on Him. He alone must become our source of strength, provision, protection, and direction.

God has the ability to protect us from every trial or distress. Instead, He often chooses to deliver us in the midst of trials. In Psalm 50:15 we are told, "Call upon me in the day of trouble: I will deliver thee, and thou shalt glorify me." God's goal through our trials is to strengthen our dependence on Him. We must trust Him to work in the ways and in the time frame that will produce the best in our lives and the most glory for His name. As we call to the Lord in our distress, He will deliver us.



5. OVERCOME EVIL WITH GOOD.

Jesus gave His disciples a clear set of instructions about responding to those who made life miserable for them. (See Matthew 5:44.) These directions are completely opposite to what we would naturally do:

- Love your enemies.
- Bless those who curse you.
- Do good to those who hate you.
- Pray for those who despitefully use you and persecute you.

Such responses would never be a person's natural tendency, but they do reflect the heart of God: "Be not overcome of evil but overcome evil with good" (Romans 12:21).

God promises to give a blessing to those who reward evil with good. Although we cannot fully predict or describe that blessing, we know that it will include the power of genuine love. "Be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another, love as brethren.. not rendering evil for evil, or railing for railing: but contrariwise blessing; knowing that ye are thereunto called, that ye should inherit a blessing" (I Peter 3:8–9).

If you react to a person who offends you and become bitter toward him, you actually put yourself in an emotional prison.

Bitterness will control your thought life, your emotions, your free time, and your health. In order to be freed from this prison, you must forgive.

Scripture provides many examples of those who forgave offenders, including Job, Stephen, and Jesus Christ:

- Job's companions were about to encounter God's wrath, but Job prayed for them and God delivered Job: "And the Lord turned the captivity of Job, when he prayed for his friends . . ." (Job 42:10).
- Stephen prayed for God to forgive his murderers, even as they were stoning him: "And they stoned Stephen, [who was] calling upon God, and saying, Lord Jesus, receive my spirit. And he kneeled down, and cried with a loud voice, Lord, lay not this sin to their charge. And when he had said this, he fell asleep" (Acts 7:59–60).
- Because Jesus was wounded for our transgressions and bruised for our iniquities (see Isaiah 53:5), we are among the group of people He released when He said, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34).

The Rewards of Responding with Grace

As God faithfully pours out His grace upon us in the midst of each fiery trial, we can endure hardships and overcome the enemy in God's strength. (See II Chronicles 20:15.) Scripture reveals that



there are great rewards for responding to trials with grace, including those listed below: The strength of Godly character - "We glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; and patience, experience; and experience, hope: And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us" (Romans 5:3–5). Exceeding joy in God's glory - "Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial, which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's suffering; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy" (I Peter 4:12–13). God's strength in our weaknesses - ". . . Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. Therefore, I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong" (II Corinthians 12:9–10). **Fellowship with Christ** - "I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord: for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and do count them but dung, that I may win Christ . . . that I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death" (Philippians 3:8–10). **Heavenly rewards -** "Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you" (Matthew 5:11-12). **Reigning with Christ** - "It is a faithful saying: For if we be dead with him, we shall also live with him: If we suffer, we shall also reign with him" (II Timothy 2:11-12). God has assured us that He will not permit us to be attacked with trials or temptations that are too overwhelming for us to handle. He will grant us grace to be overcomers. In I Corinthians 10:12–13, the Apostle Paul exhorts us with these words: "Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall. There hath no temptation taken you, but such as is common to man: but **God is** faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able: but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that



ye may be able to bear it."










Family - Ecclesia

- The Christian family, the most basic unit of Church life, is sometimes called the domestic Church.
- "It is in the bosom of the family that parents are, by word and example, the first heralds of the faith for their children. The home is the first school of Christian life and a school for human enrichment"
- "It is in the family that one learns the love and faithfulness of the Lord, and the need to respond to these."



- Parents teach "by word" and so become "the first heralds of the faith about their children." In short, parents preach the gospel. -This can occur in any number of ways. Parents read Bible stories to their children. Families often pray together. They gather for meals.
- Families become communities where the love that is practiced is reflected in the words that are shared.
- Because love is practiced in word and deed, family life becomes sacramental. Section 1657 of the Catechism notes that families exercise their "priesthood of the baptized" by "the reception of the sacraments."
- Families go to the sacraments and parents take their children to the sacraments, but the sacraments are not to be peak experiences isolated from family life.
- Sacraments provide ways to understand ordinary family life and families add meaning to the sacraments.

For example, having meals together is crucial for the health and wellbeing of the family. The time together and the conversation keep family members connected to one another, and this reality points to the importance of frequent communion with God. Likewise, the Eucharist reminds the family that meals together, meals where love is shared, are times when God is present.



- Another point that stands out in the sacramentality of family life is reconciliation. It was an essential aspect of Jesus' work, from his healing to his preaching and even to his death and resurrection. -The church continues this ministry in the sacrament of reconciliation, a sacrament that helps to name sin, to strengthen the resolve to turn away from it, and to restore relationships with God and others.
- In family life, this is essential. Genuine love requires reconciliation. Couples do not last without the ability to address their failings, and children struggle to succeed if they do not learn how to handle conflict.

Because families practice love through their actions, preach the gospel by their words, and live together in ways that draw from and point to the sacraments, Catholicism refers to the family as an Ecclesia domestica (CCC, 1656), a domestic church. The family is a gathered people who try to live out Christ's call to love God and neighbor.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Divide into teams of 6-8. Give each person a different coloured crayon. Place large charts, one for each team, about 3 metres away from where they have lined up. Tell them that they cannot change places in the line, and they may only use the crayon they have been given. Explain their task is to draw a picture of a farm (or another picture of your choosing). The first person on each team runs to the paper and begins to draw the parts of the picture which link to the colour of their crayon. After 15 seconds they must return to their teams and be replaced by the next person in the line who will add their colour to the picture. Continue the relay until all of the team members get a chance to draw a part of the picture. Display the pictures. You may have to get each team to explain their work of art to you and the rest of the group!

Theme Presentation	Presentation: 20:00 Video: 10:00	The Syro-Malabar Catholic Church is one of the 23 Eastern (Oriental) Catholic Churches in full communion with Rome. It has over 5 million believers. It is a sui juris (autonomous) Church governed by the Synod of Bishops headed by the Major Archbishop. The Syro-Malabar Church is an Apostolic Church which traces its origin to St. Thomas, the Apostle, who landed at Cranganore (Muziris) in 52 AD and founded seven Christian communities in Kerala, at Palayur, Cranganore, Kokkamangalam, Kottakavu (Parur), Quilon, Niranam, and Chayal. St. Thomas was martyred in A.D. 72 at Mylapore, near Chennai/Madras. The early Christian community in India was known as St. Thomas Christians. They were also called Nazranis, meaning those who follow the path of Jesus of Nazareth.	



- From early centuries, the Church of St. Thomas Christians came into contact with the East Syrian Church, which also traces its origin to Apostle Thomas.
- From the 4th century until the end of the 16th century Thomas Christians were governed by Bishops who were appointed and sent by the Patriarch of the East Syrian Church.
- The Thomas Christians developed a unique system of ecclesiastical administration with the Bishops from Persia in charge of liturgical and spiritual matters and the local Archdeacon of All India (A priest) heading the Christian community and handling the administration of the Church through Palliyogam (early form of Synod).
- Thus St. Thomas Christians shared the liturgical, theological, spiritual, and other ecclesiastical traditions with the East Syrian Church; in socio-cultural organization and practices, however, they were distinctively Indian.
- With the arrival of the Portuguese in the 16th Century a new era in the life of St. Thomas Christians started. East Syrian Bishops stopped coming; Archdeacon lost his position; and what followed was the Latinization of the liturgy and the ecclesial administration.
- It resulted in a division of St. Thomas Christians into two groups, of which the group who resisted Latin rule formed a separate community under the Archdeacon. Later they accepted the theological and liturgical traditions of the West Syrian Orthodox Church of Antioch and came to be known as the Jacobite Church. They were further divided into several independent Churches.
- The group that remained faithful to Rome came to be known as the Syro-Malabar Church, a name which means Syrian Christians of the Malabar Coast (Kerala).

- In 1887 Syro-Malabar Catholics got their hierarchy restored by Pope Leo XIII. It has initiated a process of liturgical reform and restoration of the oriental identity.
- In 2004, the Holy See granted full administrative powers to the Syro-Malabar Church, including the power to elect bishops.
- Mar George Cardinal Alencherry is the present Major Archbishop of Syro-Malabar Church.
- At present Syro-Malabar Church has 35 Eparchies (Dioceses) and over 5 million faithfuls. Today Syro-Malabar Church is present all over the world with its effective witness to the faith.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:


Teams must build the tallest tower that they can using only the marshmallows and spaghetti. The tower must be free-standing, so the young people aren't allowed to support it once it's completed. Set a time limit that they must finish their tower by. Warn them when they're about 1 minute from the end so that they can ensure that their tower's free-standing. The winning team is the one that has the tallest spaghetti and marshmallow tower. If it's not easily identifiable which is the tallest tower, use a measuring tape. In the unlikely event that two teams have towers that are the exact same height, set up a tiebreaker. Teams must pick up and move their construction to the other side of the room. The team with the tallest freestanding tower once it's been moved is the winner. (N.B. players aren't allowed to fix any breakages while it gets moved).

Theme Presentation	PPT: 10:00 Video: 8:00	Sacramental Living / Holy Spirit - PPT Presentation The Catholic imagination sees the goodness of God reflected in the unfolding of human life and love, in the grandeur and fragility of nature, the simplicities of bread, oil, wine and water, in word and gesture and most extraordinarily in the life of Jesus of Nazareth, the Word made flesh. It is him we hear, see with our own eyes, watch, and touch with our hands in the sacramental life of the Church. It is his life we share when we participate in the sacraments of the Church. The sacraments of the Church are among the greatest means through which we hear the best of 'good news' and are touched and embraced by God in ways which lead us to life. Jesus is himself the great sacrament of God's love. Jesus was the fullest revelation possible of God's goodness and love. We believe that Jesus is both Son of God and Son of Mary — truly human and truly divine. In his person, and through his actions, words and gestures Jesus made God and God's love present on earth. He was, and is still, for us 'the image of the unseen God'(Col:5), the 'Word made flesh' who lived among us (John 1) and hence the greatest sacrament of God.



- From the vast array of God's gifts and in response to words and examples of Jesus, the Church chooses a few simple things: water, oil, bread and wine and some basic human gestures and calling upon the Holy Spirit makes them capable of drawing human beings deeply into the life of God.
 - · Baptism
 - Confirmation
 - Eucharist
 - Reconciliation
 - Anointing of the Sick
 - Marriage
 - Holy Orders

All these are visible, tangible ways in which we are brought by the Church to an encounter with God in the midst of our human lives.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:



How many books are in the Bible? Although the word bible means "book," the Bible is a library of books gathered together into one sacred volume. The Bible consists of 73 books — 46 in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament. As you may know, Protestant Bibles only include 39 Old Testament books. Catholics recognize seven books as canonical (part of our sacred body of Scripture) that Protestants do not consider canonical: Tobit, Judith, 1 Maccabees, 2 Maccabees, Wisdom, Sirach, and Baruch. These books were included in the Greek translation of the Old Testament used in the early Church. At the time of the Protestant Reformation in the 16th century, Protestants decided to follow the Hebrew canon, which does not include these seven books, while the Catholic Church continued to retain all the books that were included in the Greek Bible and read at the time of Christ. 2. When was the Bible written? The ancients were not particularly interested in keeping meticulous track of dates. Books of the Bible were not dated at the time they were written, and their authors were often not named. The composition of the Old Testament was a long and complicated process that began with oral traditions that were eventually written down. Many of these stories and traditions were then edited and arranged over a matter of centuries until they eventually took the shape they have today. Dating the books of the Old Testament is difficult, but most scholars give a range from the 10th to the second century B.C. The composition of the New Testament is much more straightforward. Though we don't have exact dates for these books either, we can be confident that they were composed between A.D. 50 to 110. 3. In what language was the Bible written? The simple answer is that the Old Testament was written in

Hebrew, and the New Testament was written in Greek. There are a few exceptions to this in the Old Testament. Portions of Daniel were written in Aramaic, and the seven deuterocanonical books discussed above, as well as portions of Esther, were also written in Greek.

By the time the New Testament was written, Greek was the common language of the Roman Empire — among Jews and Gentiles alike — so the New Testament was composed entirely in Greek, aside from the occasional Aramaic word or phrase.

4. Who decided which books would be included in the Bible? The final, authoritative set of Scriptures that we have in the Bible is called the "canon." But how was the canon formed? What we now call the canon of the Old Testament was fairly settled at the time of Jesus. Jews at that time had access to their Scriptures in both Hebrew (the original language) and Greek (a Greek translation was prepared in the third century B.C.).

The content of the New Testament canon took several centuries to firm up, but it was essentially agreed upon by the fourth century. Each book of the New Testament canon had a strong link with one of the apostles, was used consistently in the early Christian liturgy, and was judged to authentically convey the Good News of Jesus Christ. Interestingly, the Church did not officially declare which books were included in the canon of Scripture until the Council of Trent in the 16th century.

ICEBREAKER – NEW TESTAMENT – OLD TESTAMENT

Age Category: 10+

Duration: 10 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

A list of books in the Bible (please see the attachment at the end), a tape to mark the line.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Printed list of books in the Bible, draw a line with the tape to divide the area into two.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Draw a line on the floor and name one side of the line as the Old Testament and the other side as the New Testament. Have all members of the group line up on one side of the line. The teacher calls out the name of a book in the Bible; if the book belongs to the New Testament, the students should move to the side of the New Testament. If the book belongs to the Old Testament, students should move to the side Old Testament. They are to listen to your commands. They must jump quickly to whichever side you called or be called out. Those who are last to move to the correct side get eliminated. As the facilitator you then start yelling commands, trying to trick the people by saying the names of the books quickly.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Students are divided into teams. Each team must select a captain who will be the spokesperson. There are 4 categories: under each category are 5 questions, increasing in points and difficulty. The first team to go picks a category and point amount. The host then reads the question. Once the question is read, they have x amount of time to come up with an answer. The spokesperson will then respond with an answer. A correct response earns the point value of the question they chose and the opportunity to select the next clue from the board. An incorrect response or failure to answer within the time limit given, gets no points and gives the other teams' spokesperson the opportunity to 'ring' in and respond and get the point if correct. Theme Presentation	00:05	The words of Scripture are, as Vatican II explained, the words of both God and human beings. This means that God truly speaks to us in the sacred Word, but he does so in every case through a human being, each with his own history, culture, personality, and ideas. God did not control the minds and writing hands of the authors of Scripture as though they were robots or puppets. Inspiration is not dictation. Rather, God's Spirit filled the minds and hearts of biblical authors with the truth that God wanted to communicate, and this truth was then faithfully communicated by a human author with his own words, style, and abilities. ICEBREAKER – SPREAD THE WORD

Age Category: 10+

Duration: 10 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

A container, small pieces of paper with short Bible verses written on them.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Have the pieces of paper with Bible verses and keep them in the container.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Get the students to sit in a circle. Choose several bible verses that have positive themes or relate to good character. Write them down on small pieces of paper and put them in a container. Players sit in a circle and one player blindly chooses a verse and reads it to himself. He then whispers the verse to the person sitting to his right, who then passes it on to the next person until it reaches the last person of the circle. This person announces the verse to the group to show how a message can change when it is passed from mouth to mouth.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

(FOR THE TEACHER)

Lectio Divina

The best way to teach children to read the Bible is to teach them how to do Lectio Divina. Lectio Divina simply means Sacred Reading. It is a practice of reading the Bible prayerfully. The process is pretty simple, and it follows five basic steps:

- 1. Read
- 2. Meditate
- 3. Pray
- 4. Contemplate
- 5. Act

Explain the method to students. Ask them to consider the following questions while you read

- What do you see, hear, and feel?
- Where are you in this story?
- What do you feel in your heart?
- When you take this down from your brain into your heart, what do you feel?
- What does it feel like knowing you are here?
- What are you saying?
- What are you doing?
- What is God/Jesus doing?
- What is God/Jesus saying?
- Ask young people to close their eyes when you read Scripture, and then ask them what they saw, smelled, or felt. Where did they place themselves in the story? Why does that matter?
- Have young people draw a Scripture story as you read it.



• Provide moments of silence during the prayer, prompting young people to listen for what God has to say.

Read from the Bible: Luke 19:1-10

He entered Jericho and was going through the town and suddenly a man whose name was Zacchaeus made his appearance; he was one of the senior tax collectors and a wealthy man. He kept trying to see which Jesus was, but he was too short and could not see him for the crowd; so, he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus who was to pass that way. When Jesus reached the spot, he looked up and spoke to him, 'Zacchaeus, come down. Hurry, because I am to stay at your house today.' And he hurried down and welcomed him joyfully. They all complained when they saw what was happening. 'He has gone to stay at a sinner's house,' they said. But Zacchaeus stood his ground and said to the Lord, 'Look, sir, I am going to give half my property to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody, I will pay him back four times the amount.' And Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man too is a son of Abraham; for the Son of man has come to seek out and save what was lost.'.

ACTIVITY 2 - FOUR CORNERS (HEAVEN, EARTH, PURGATORY, HELL)

Age Category: 10+

Duration: 10 Minutes

MATERIALS REQUIRED:

4 Sheets of Paper with Words Hell, Heaven, Earth, and Purgatory.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Place the 4 sheets in four corners of the room..

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:



Number the four corners of the room. Put up a sign at each corner, numbered 1, 2, 3, and 4. (Instead, name the corners Earth, Hell, Heaven and Purgatory). Make space at the sides of the room. Clear the area near all four walls, so children can easily move between corners. The teacher should stand in the middle. Tell the players the rules of the game:

The teacher should count down from 10 to 0, with his/her eyes closed, loudly and slowly. Everyone else moves to one of the four corners, very quietly. When the teacher finishes counting, she chooses a number from 1 to 4 (with her eyes still closed). Anyone standing in the corner she chose has to sit down. Anyone who isn't in a corner when the counting is done also has to sit down.

Keep playing with the remaining students. After each round, the person in the middle can open her eyes and see who she knocked out. Then she closes her eyes again and counts from 10 to 0. Each round works the same way. Whoever is in the corner she chooses each round has to sit out for the rest of the game.

Adjust the rules once most people are out. Once there are only a few people left, the game can take a long time to finish. Add extra rules to speed it up:

- Once there are eight people or fewer, each corner can only hold 2 people maximum.
- Once there are four people or fewer, each corner can only hold 1 person maximum.
- Play until there's one winner.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

The aim of our life is Heaven, living in complete union with God. The Bible is the word of God which gives us the instructions on how to lead a life aiming for heaven.

Theme Presentation	00.10	God's word is alive in 3 ways: it is effective, relational, and revealing. 1. God's Word Is Effective Throughout scripture, God's word is the agent to accomplish exactly what He intends. In Genesis 1:3-27, God speaks, and the world is. Psalm 33:6 echoes the notion of His breath creating the heavens and earth. In Psalm 107:20, God's word brings about healing. In Isaiah 55:10-11, God promises that His word never returns to Him empty but will accomplish His will. In the gospels, Jesus' very word heals, calms storms, and even raises the dead. We can be confident that what God has spoken will be realized.	



2. God's Word Is Relational

In Genesis 1:28-30 and 2:16, God speaks to his creation, Adam, to instruct him. In Genesis 15:1, the word of the Lord comes to Abram to establish a covenant relationship with him. Throughout the Old Testament, God's word is moving in his people through Moses, the judges, and the prophets, to instruct, rebuke, and encourage them in their faithfulness toward Him. The relational component of the Word of God, however, culminates in the New Testament. John 1:14 says, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth" . Jesus himself is described as God's very Word, sent to the world to reveal God's will to us directly.



3. God's Word Is Revealing

The Bible is God's special revelation to man, intended to direct us to salvation in Christ and contains all we need to know to live a life that pleases God in obedience and righteousness (2 Tim 3:14-16). Like Hebrews 4:12 (above) says, God's word has the powerful and unique ability of discerning and exposing in us our truest thoughts and intentions. It will encourage, convict, and comfort us in ways that apply even to the details of our lives.

Example of Mother Teresa





		The above verses changed the life of Mother Theresa.
		Example: Sr Rani Maria's family forgave her murderer Samandar Singh.
		Sister Rani Maria Vattalil, a member of the Franciscan Clarist Congregation, was stabbed 54 times in front of more than 50 passengers on January 25, 1995. Vattalil's murderer, Samundar Singh, was sentenced to life imprisonment. The nun's younger sister — also a religious, Sister Selmi Paul — visited Singh in prison in 2002, and tied a Rakhi to his hand. The Rahki is part of the celebration of the Hindu festival of Raksha Bandhan. Singh, overcome by this sign of forgiveness, expressed his repentance for the murder. In 2006, at the request of Vattalil's family and Catholic leaders, Singh was released from prison.

ICEBREAKER – BIBLE RELAY RACE

Age Category: 10+

Duration: 10 Minutes



MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Black Board, Two Bibles.

PREPARATIONS FOR THE ACTIVITY:

Selected Bible Verses.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Create a list of popular bible verses like John 3:16 and Proverbs 3:6. Divide the students into two equal teams. Tell the teams to line up. Place two Bibles on a table several feet away. Explain that on the word "Go," the first player on each team must race to a Bible and find the first verse on the list. He must write down the page number next to the verse on the list, and then run back to tag the next player on his team. The next player must do the same to find the second verse and so on. For assistance, the students can look at the table of contents for help. The first team to finish the list with the correct page numbers wins the game.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

The Bible has an answer to each problem in our life. We don't need to memorise the page numbers though. When you need guidance, spend some quiet time with God, ask the Lord what He wants to tell you, then open the Bible and read it. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you to understand it then act accordingly.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Divide students into groups. Have each group develop a short skit that shows an act of love or compassion. Each group will be given a scenario and a Bible verse which is relevant to it (some examples are given above). For example, they might show forgiving a friend that lied or giving food to a homeless person, helping someone else in class, being friends with someone that looks alone, helping parents when they are tired after work etc. Allow the kids to act out their skits.

MESSAGE FROM THE ACTIVITY

The word of God is not to be kept inside the book: we need to use it in our daily life. Let us read the Bible every day.

B-ACTIVITY 1

MINEFIELD GAME

Age Category: 13 to 18

Maximum No of Participants: 4-6 Groups of Maximum 7participants

Duration: 45 -60 Minutes



AIM:

Conviction - Participants develop a conviction that Faith is a Gift and an Act.

Attitudes - Participant develops a mindset that Faith should be nourished through ongoing charity and repentance.

Habits - Participants must practice being (1) Alone with holy trinity and (2) Practice Examination of conscience (Ongoing repentance) and (3) acts of service (Ongoing fellowship-family and parish)

Aims are developed on three levels: Conviction, Attitude, Habit.

- A conviction is a strong belief or opinion that something is certain.
- An attitude can be a positive or negative evaluation of people, objects, events, activities, and ideas.
- A habit is a behaviour that is repeated regularly. This behaviour can be an action, a routine, or a lifestyle tend to occur subconsciously.

RESOURCES:

Paper Or Training Disk Markers - Minefield, Chocolates - Lollies (God's graces), Markers – at least one per group, Blind folders - 20

FACILITATOR PREPARATION:

Facilitators imagine that they must simulate a minefield in a given space. Organise a starting point and finishing point. Facilitator to assemble a minefield within an ample open space. Use Papers or training disk markers as Mines. Scatter the paper or disk markers as mines between starting and finishing points. Facilitator may need to ensure the mines are scattered, leaving only narrow spaces to walk. Facilitator also to get the Balloons ready. Scatter each balloon in a designated playing field (do not blow the balloons at this stage). The balloons should be roughly 3-5 feet apart. Facilitator also gets the chocolates or lollies ready and scatters them on the ground as well. Facilitators can use their discretion to add more obstacles to make it more fun (Optional). Get the blindfolders ready.



HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Facilitator asks participants to form in teams based on their animals. Facilitator tells within each group they should have explorers and navigators. Select 3-5 members from each team as explorers. Assign remaining team members as navigators. Blindfold the explorers who volunteered, and they need to take the journey to cross the minefield from the starting point to the finish point. Navigators need to verbally give directions to explorers to avoid touching mine and collect all the balloons and chocolates. Team members as navigators assist them in setting a starting point. Facilitator says when explorers (blindfolded members) need to start crossing the minefield blind folded.

Conditions for crossing the minefield

They could not touch the mines. They should walk as a team holding hands together or placing their hands on shoulders (inline). Collect as many chocolates as possible. Collect as many balloons as well. Explorers should complete with other teams walking over minefields towards the finishing point. They will be competing with other team members. Navigators will provide verbal direction to blindfolded members to avoid mine and provide instructions to collect as many chocolates and balloons as possible. If any team member touches the mine, that person will stand, make the animal sound (their group animal), and continue his journey. All the group stands and makes the animal sound and continues the journey. Facilitator checks who got to the finishing point first and who got the maximum number of balloons and chocolates. Allocate 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places, respectively.

FACILITATOR BRIEFING FOR PARTICIPANTS (Max 5- 10 Mins only)

- Chocolates represent Gods graces
- Balloons represent our problems
- Mines represent our sins that blow up the grace of God.

Conviction

• Faith is a gift (like chocolate) but along with we also collect problems (balloons) in life. We sin, and sin diminishes the effects of faith. (Mortal sin blows up sanctifying grace with us.)

Attitude

- Faith should be practiced daily through love (Love is constantly seeking goodness in others, Act of love, St John Paul II). Fellowship is critical to growing in faith. Through fellowship, we practice loving. (Family and Parish)
- We must trust that faith gives us the strength to deal with our problems.
- We must repent daily and purify ourselves daily for God's grace to be active in our life.

Habits that participants need to form at home-Faith Building habits.

- ALONE WITH JESUS EVERY DAY: Find time to be alone with God. We approach God with nothing, not
 to solve your problems, not expecting to help you but just to be with him. This way, you let God's
 grace come to you, and this grace will help you develop resources and the capacity to deal with your
 problems.
- EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE BEFORE YOU SLEEP: Repent daily
- PRACTICE ACTS OF SERVICE ON DAILY BASIS (God is love).

Other comments

Why do we feel nothing special about having faith?



- 1. We do not use our faith: We do not taste our faith: We need to chew the chocolate. We do not use God's grace that we receive through faith.
- 2. We do not trust in our faith > In life, we overly identify ourselves with our problems and do not TRUST faith can overcome any issues we have.
- 3. We do not repent and keep attached to our sins. Repentance is ongoing and should occur daily.

Why do we need faith?

- God wants us to be truly happy. This requires having faith and leading a holy life.
- There are two kinds of happiness Perfect happiness and imperfect happiness (St Thomas Aquinas)
- Perfect happiness (beatitudo) is not possible in this lifetime, but only in the afterlife for those who achieve a direct perception of God. But we should aim for perfect happiness daily. (St Thomas Aquinas)
- There can be imperfect happiness (felicitas) attainable in this lifetime, and God is not against this, but we cannot make this the front end of our lives. (St Thomas Aguinas)



Printing and Set-Up Directions

The game should be played in groups of 5-7 players. For larger groups, print additional copies of all materials. Printed sheets to be arranged inside the box in such a way that the participants cannot read the sheets from outside if your box is transparent. Print all sheets given and arrange them inside the specified boxes and lock them by sticking the correct lock on the boxes. Hand out the Prikley Stowaway story, the animal feeding note and the puzzle for box 3 to each team leaders.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

Prepare and keep the box's ready prior to the game. Animator to start by introducing the theme Faith using various examples from the bible ending by explaining Noah's Faith in God. Use power point if you have the technology to make this part more interesting. If you are using technology, you can start by showing the following clips from the movie "Evan Mighty".

This is an activity based on Noah's Ark. Once groups are with the puzzle box's animator explains that groups are not supposed to open the boxes unless they get the password. Each group is given a set of three boxes with the challenge. Clear instructions must be given that each box is locked with the type of lock which is stuck on the box. When the students get the password, they should take it to the animator, who checks the password and allows the group to open the box. Then the group continue to solve the puzzle to open the second box and so on. 25 points allocated to each group for solving each section and the group that wins the challenge first gets 100 points. Make students to fill in the reflection questions in groups after they have completed the game.

FACILITATOR BRIEFING FOR PARTICIPANTS

Just like the puzzles and codes in this activity, we can easily doubt matters of Faith because none of us fully understand all the theology behind our Faith. But we must not close the door on truth just because something doesn't immediately make sense to us. If we seek to know the truth, if we have true faith in our Lord and Saviour, the Holy Spirit who inspired the scriptures and strengthened the scared apostles will unravel the mysteries of our Faith, just like you were able to decode the puzzles, and make us incredible disciples for Jesus. If we bring our confusions to our Lord in Faith and openness, all will be made clear by the Spirit. We will have our temptations to doubt removed and we will be able to have true faith that goes far beyond our human reasoning alone. Bring to our Lord any and every question you have with expectation that you will receive what you need. Faith comes through a pure and simple openness to the Voice of God speaking within our soul.

Concluding Prayer.

Let us pray, my loving Lord, you invited all of us to come to you, to see you and to have faith in you. You truly are the son of God and king of all. Please open our minds to all that you wish to say to us so that we may shed our doubts and come to a transforming faith in all things. Jesus, My Lord and God, I trust in you. Amen.

F - ACTIVITY 3

BIBLE ESCAPE ROOM - 'Seek and You Shall Find'

Theme: Faith, Hope, Charity (Love)

Slogan: Seek, Find and Rejoice

Age Category: Year 9 - 12

Aim: To escape a locked room using a series of puzzles and clues.

Maximum No of Participants: 40

Duration: 60 Minutes

Relevant bible passages to reflect on: Luke 15:1-7 (The Parable of the Lost Sheep), Luke 15: 8-9 (The Parable of the Lost Coin), Luke 15: 11-32 (The Parable of the Lost Son, also known as the Prodigal Son), Matthew 13: 18-23 (The parable of the Sower), Matthew 13:31 (The parable of the Mustard Seed), John 1:29, Revelation 17:14 (Jesus, the Lamb of God Who Takes Away the Sins of the World).

MATERIALS REQUIRED:

- Chessboard (Paper Copies can be Used) 4 Nos
- Scrabble (Paper Copies Can Be Used) 4 Nos
- Recipe Cards (Can Be Printed on Cardboard or Paper) 6 Recipes Per Room 24 Nos
- Stuffed Toys, including a Lamb/sheep Stuffed Toy 4 Lamb toys (The rest is up to you.)
- Small Pouch 12 Nos (Place one pouch with the mustard seeds around the lamb. Stuff the other pouches with miscellaneous items and put them around the other toy's necks.)
- Packet of Mustard Seeds 4 Nos
- Glass Jar 4 Nos
- Coins There should be a queen coin in each jar. The number of coins in each jar is determined by the size of the jar.
- Chess Pieces (Whole set, if possible. If not, make sure the pieces include a white King and Queen.)
- Picture frame of a man with 2sons 4 Nos
- Spices in a Jar 4 Nos
- Word Lock 4 Nos
- Small Pot Plants (4 per room, each labelled: Thorny Soil, Rocky Soil, Hard Soil, Good Soil) 16 Nos You will need 4 rooms for this activity. Each room will be outfitted with a series of clues which must be solved to escape the room. More detail below.

HOW TO PLAY:

Split the group into 4 teams. Each group will be escorted to a different room, blindfolded, and locked into the room with a help person, who can provide up to 3 clues to help the group. The group must escape the room within the hour. The door is locked, and the help person starts their timer. If the timer sounds, and the group has not escaped, the help person can take the group through the room and show them how they could have escaped.





HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY / RULES ETC:

The Escape Room's solve

The Bible passage below needs to be printed on a table. The passage contains codewords in BLOCK LETTERS which should reveal the words 'PRODIGAL SON'. "there was a man with two sons. the younger said to his father "give me my share of the estate." so the father divided his property between the two sons. some days late**R**, the y**O**unger son gathere**D** all his belon**G**ings and started off for a distant Land where he squandered his wealth in loose living....my father said "my Son, you are always with me, and everything I have is y**O**urs. but this brother of yours was dead and has come back to life. he was lost and is fou**N**d. and for that we had to celebrate and rejoice".

The 'Son' clue should take players to the picture frame of a man with two sons which will have the word 'spice cupboard' taped to its back. Players go to the cupboard labelled spice cupboard which contains recipe cards and 4 jars with the following spices: mustard seed, coriander powder, turmeric, chili powder. Next to it should be various recipes and a word lock. Only ONE recipe card should include the 4 spices (LAMB curry). Word lock answer is 'LAMB'. The Answer LAMB should direct players to a lamb/sheep toy in the room (NOTE: there will be other animals in the room with pouches around its neck as distraction).

The correct lamb/sheep toy has a pouch around its neck with a packet of mustard seeds in it. The back of the packet should have the words 'PLANT ME' written on the front. Players should empty the packet's contents on the correct soil – they need to find the pot plant with the good soil to plant the seeds. The good pot plant's underside needs to be checked and will lead players to the scrabble board.

Players need to unscramble the words on the board – one of the scrambled words should be coin. Make the other scrambled words random items that are not biblical. In the mix of coins in the coin jar, players need to locate the only different coin – the coin with the queen's face. Queen's face will correspond to White Queen's chess piece found above the coin jar labelled "White Queen= D1" The white queen's chess piece will lead players to the chessboard. Once they arrange the King and Queen in their rightful spots, the door will unlock.

Escape room solved.

FACILITATOR BRIEFING FOR PARTICIPANTS

Jesus taught using parables to help people understand something about Him and His Kingdom.

Ask: Which parables were referenced in the room?

Read the following bible passages and reflect:

- Luke 15:1-7 (The parable of the Lost Sheep).
- Luke 15: 8-9 (The parable of the Lost Coin)
- Luke 15: 11-32 (The parable of the Lost Son, also known as the Prodigal Son)

Ask:

- Have you ever lost anything?
- What does it feel like to be lost?
- When you find what has been lost, how do you feel?
- Why does someone seek out another person when they have been lost?
- How essential is hope and faith when finding something or someone that has been lost?

Read the following bible passages and reflect:

- Matthew 13: 18-23 (The Parable of the Sower)
- Matthew 13:31 (The Parable of the Mustard Seed)

Ask: How important is it to nurture your faith? In what ways do you nurture your own faith?

Duration: 10-15 Minutes

Relevant bible passages to reflect on: Luke 15:1-7 (The Parable of the Lost Sheep), Luke 15: 8-9 (The Parable of the Lost Coin), Luke 15: 11-32 (The Parable of the Lost Son, also known as the Prodigal Son), Matthew 13: 18-23 (The parable of the Sower), Matthew 13:31 (The parable of the Mustard Seed), John 1:29, Revelation 17:14 (Jesus, the Lamb of God Who Takes Away the Sins of the World).

MATERIALS REQUIRED:

Paper, Markers & Pens, Balloons (Different Colours)

FACILITATOR PREPARATION:

Get markers, papers ready. Ensure to have additional balloons. Inform participants to keep the balloons they have collected from game 1.



B-ACTIVITY 1

BALLOON CATERPILLAR RACE

Age Category: Year 9 - 12

Aim: Learning family values - HUMILITY, MEEKNESS, BOLDNESS through Caterpillar race.

Maximum No of Participants: NA

Duration: 10-15 Minutes

MATERIALS REQUIRED:

One inflated balloon per person (minus one) and masking tape.

FACILITATOR INSTRUCTIONS:



Apart from our Lord Jesus the best role model we have for fellowship in family and church is our lady. She is going to teach the virtues through rosary (Joyful mysteries). Before you begin, place two strips of masking tape on the ground to signify start and finish lines, approximately 10-15 feet apart. Ask participants to line up shoulder-to-shoulder behind the starting line. Hand each of them a balloon except for the last person in the line. Instruct them that, in a moment, each of them will put the balloon

between their shoulders (i.e., two people standing next to each other will be holding the balloon on either side with their shoulders). They must hold the balloon there without touching it with their hands. They need to walk to the finish line as a group. If any balloons touch the ground, the entire team must start again. Obstacles: In between the start and finishing two volunteers will be holding a rope to (few feet above the ground, enough height for participants able to cross over).

Depends on the group facilitator can groups compete each other.

Facilitator also can expand the race doing Balloon rail.

Balloon Rail is an excellent way to test teamwork and coordination, as the success of the team depends on equal participation of every team member. The game also encourages team members to open and share creative ideas, thereby increasing team bonding.



FACILITATOR BRIEFING:

Participants sit in circles and reflect. In this exercise we must lower yourself and not let the balloon fall for the team to win. So, lowering yourself for the good of others is ethically beautiful. Our lady reflects on the following values humility, meekness, and boldness.

Scenario - Can use the PPT

Angel said to our Lady you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Highest. This could be a terrifying announcement to an unmarried young orphan girl who might get stone to death for becoming pregnant before getting married. Our lady use to describe herself in Magnificant demonstrates her profound humility.

Facilitator shows Magnificant or asks anyone to recite Magnificant.



- My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my savior. "He has performed mighty deeds with his arm
- He has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts
- He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble
- He has filled the hungry with good things but has sent the rich away empty

Facilitator

- Latin for Humility comes from humilitas
- Humility is one of the attributes of God. For example, some religions say Jesus is not son of God but only a prophet. This is because they cannot accept one of the attributes of God is humility. Nothing is impossible for God and if he decides to unite his own divinity in human flesh out of his love for his children it is outrageous to deny Jesus's divinity. (Philippians: 2;7-8). God unite himself, unite his own divinity to a human form who is Jesus. This is radical realisation how much God love and value us. Then bible also explains we are created in God's image. Demons have hatred for humans that we are created in God' image.

- We can confuse boldness with arrogance Arrogance is taking credit for yourself when you are supposed to give credit to God. Giving yourself glory
- People confuse humility with timidity. Avoid Timidity (Vice) Excessive fear. Society expected us to be timid. But this is not Catholic virtue.

Summary -Reflect on one of the God's attributes as humility.

- Humility is a moral virtue that keeps a person from reaching beyond himself. (Psalm -131)
- God's humility is seen in passion and death in the holy eucharist. (Luke 23: 34)
- God himself coming to us in the form of bread and wine is a profoundly reflection of God's humility and love. (John 14: 9)

Slogan: Seek, Find and Rejoice

Age Category: Year 9 - 12

Aim: Learning Family Virtues, Fellowship, Love of Neighbour'.

Maximum No of Participants: NA

Duration: 15-20 Minutes

MATERIALS REQUIRED:





FACILITATOR INSTRUCTIONS:

You and your friends will circle up and join your hands together to form a human knot out of your arms. The goal of the game is to untangle yourselves without letting go of the hands you are holding. After untangling, you will be standing once again in a regular circle, without any joined hands in the middle.



Original Position

Teams stand in circle, if you are a team of 6 or 7 then two teams should participate in this.

Hold hands and form a circle within the group. Remember this is your original position (facing inside).

Look around and remember this shape and position. This the shape you need to accomplish in next task. Everybody holding the hands should face the centre of the circle.



Cross your arms

Now take two steps into the centre of the middle.

Stay close enough you should feel the shoulder to the person next to you but not touching the shoulder.

Cross your arms and hold each other.

You are required to untangle themselves and go back to the original position without disengaging each other's hands.



Reach the original Position

Without releasing your hands, you must reach the first position. (Remember do not release your hands).

E - ACTIVITY 3- PLAN A DRAMA

FACILITATOR BRIEFING:

Facilitator splits participants into groups or asks them to organise around their group

- Each group will get the following handouts
- Based on the story group members will have 15 -20 min to prepare a drama reenacting the scene).

SAINT MAXIMILIAN KOLBE TEACHES ABOUT FELLOWSHIP (Handout for Participants)

On 17 February 1941, he was arrested by the Gestapo for hiding Jewish people. After a brief internment in a notorious Polish prison, he was sent to Auschwitz concentration camp and branded prisoner. Kolbe was sent to the work camp. This involved carrying blocks of heavy stone for the building of the crematorium wall. The work party was overseen by a vicious ex-criminal 'Bloody Krott' who came to single out Kolbe for particularly brutal treatment. On one occasion Krott made Kolbe carry the heaviest planks until he collapsed; he then beat Kolbe savagely, leaving him for dead in the mud. But fellow prisoners secretly moved him to the camp prison, where he was able to recover. Prisoners also report that he remained selfless, often sharing his meagre rations with others.

In July 1941, three prisoners appeared to have escaped from the camp; as a result, the Deputy Commander of Auschwitz ordered 10 men to be chosen to be starved to death in an underground bunker.

When one of the selected men Franciszek Gajowniczek heard he was selected, he cried out "My wife! My children!" At this point, Kolbe volunteered to take his place.

The Nazi commander replied, "What does this Polish pig want?"

Father Kolbe pointed with his hand to the condemned Franciszek Gajowniczek and repeated: "I am a Catholic priest from Poland; I would like to take his place because he has a wife and children."

One of the fellow prisoners Borgowiec said about Fr Kolbe

Kolbe before his death provided comfort to the other men and led them in prayer. "Sometimes they would be so absorbed in prayer that they did not even realize the guards had come for the daily inspection and had opened their cell door,"

Borgowiec said, asked for nothing and never complained. "He had the special gift of comforting everybody. When his fellow prisoners, writhing in agony, were begging for a drop of water, and in despair were screaming and cursing, Father Kolbe would calm them down, inspiring them to perseverance."

What is fellowship?

Participants sit in circles. Facilitator can organise the prizes for the best team (Optional)

Briefing notes About Fellowship

- Like human knot we are in body in Christ.
- "The human body has many parts, but the many parts make up one whole body. So, it is with the body of Christ." 1 Corinthians 12:12.
- Catholic spirituality is a family spirituality



What is fellowship? We look at the story of Saint Maximilian Kolbe

Like human knot we are all connected as one body in Christ. Why do we divorce spirituality and community?

Let's look at how Saint Kolbe exemplify Christian fellow ship. Even in prison that was his prison Christian fellowship - communion - is produced and exemplified in these ways:

- Communion with Jesus: Always having fellowship with Jesus.
- Catholic spirituality is a family Spirituality: His faith is not individualist praying by himself, but he gathered his fellow prisoners.
- **Communion of saints:** He never left the company of saints and martyrs who went before him. He had a special affection towards our lady.

Church militant: The Church as it exists on earth Church suffering: These are the souls in purgatory

Church triumphant: The Church in heaven; these are saints known by the Church as well as those saints known only to God.

- One holy catholic apostolic church: He was always faithful to catholic church. Our life in this world is church militant.
- **Friendship:** In prison there are people who liked him and who hated him. But he embraces both . In parish you will encounter people who don't like you and people who are very friendly to you. We need to embrace both, and this is how our charity grows and faith grows.
- **Hospitality:** Father Kolbe always share the meal with other prisoners and looked after them. hospitality calls us to welcome all people as Christ, and to remember that what we do for others we do for Christ, it also calls us to put on the heart of Christ as we receive others.

EXPLANATORY NOTES IF REQUIRED:

<u>Fellowship with Christ leads to fellowship with others:</u> One protestant student thought I was going to hell for my "pagan" religion. I had to reassure her politely that I do, in fact, accept Christ as my personal Lord and Savior every day (in the Mass). On the other end of the spectrum, some Protestants think that Catholicism is just another denomination of Christianity. It isn't. It is the Church founded by Christ.

Jesus Christ is a living person, with whom you can have a real relationship. You can talk to Him, get to know Him better through prayer and by reading His Word. You can ask His advice and respond to His grace. You can befriend Him, fall in love with Him, and commit your life to Him.

Our faith is not individualist. Faith grows in family and parish: Christian fellowship is called the foundational means of entering into the mystery of Christ, the parish is where the Church lives. Parishes are communities of faith, of action, and of hope. They are where the Gospel is proclaimed and celebrated, where believers are formed and sent to renew the earth.

<u>Communion of saints:</u> Catholics believe that we are spiritually united with the faithful that have gone before us, a union we call the "communion of the saints". We pray to the saints to seek their intercession, but we do not venerate them with the worship reserved for God alone.

<u>United under Pope:</u> Church is going to be one, instead of many, someone has to have the final say about matters of doctrine. Christ personally gave this authority to Peter, and so his successors exercise it as well (Mt 16:18).5

<u>Friendship:</u> Down through the centuries, friendship has been (and still is) a pathway along which many men and women have come close to God and gone to heaven." (Conversation with God: Daily Meditations Volume 2: Lent and Eastertide (Sceptre, 1989), Fr. Francis Fernandez)



<u>Hospitality:</u> When a stranger walk into a church door, he should be greeted with a smiling face, people should introduce themselves, welcomed him, ask your name, and directed him where to go.

Challenge 1: 4 Big Plastic or Glass Bowls, Metal Paper Clips (Small) – 40 (For Demonstration by The Resource Person During Conclusion, Have Some Dish Washing Fluid and A Cotton Bud)





Challenge 2: 4 Paper Cups, 4 Balloons, 4 Printed Goliath Sheet, 4 Sticky Tape, 4 Scissors, Ping Pong Balls or Marshmallows.

Challenge 3: 8 books of Equal Size (E.G., Two Bibles Per Team), 4 Plane Papers, 4 Large Paper Cups or Toys)

Challenge 3: 250 Large paper drink cups (55 cups per team), 1Balloon / team members, chalk, or tape to draw a line on the floor from where they use their balloon to blow down the cups may be 1m in front of the table.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY/ RULES:

Set up each of the challenges depending on the number of groups you have. Resource person must explain all 4 challenges to the participants before the teams start with the challenge. When the teacher says ready, set, go all 4 teams start doing challenge 1. Team members must work together in winning the challenge. When a group successfully completes the first activity, they proceed to challenge 2 and so on. The first team to finish all 4 challenges successfully wins 100 points. If none of the teams complete all challenges successfully, allocate points based on the number of challenges completed by the teams and find the winning team. If weather permits, these challenges will be more fun if conducted outside. Set up 4 tables per team with the different challenges.

Challenge 1: Peter walking on Water (Theme: Anything is possible with the Grace of God): Each team is provided with a bowl filled with water and about 10 paper clips. Team members must successfully float minimum 3 paperclips on water. They cannot use anything else other than the paperclips.

(Note to the resource person: If you have not done this before, watch the link given below.

(We want the participants to use the paper clip to float another paper clip.)





Challenge 2: David & Goliath (God can make the meek stronger than the strongest): Goliath picture sheet is rolled and stuck like a tube and placed on a table by the resource person in advance. Each group must now make a sling shot using paper cup, scissor, and balloon. Each of the team members get one chance to use the sling shot and put down Goliath from at least 2m distance from the table on which the Goliath paper roll was kept.










(Note to the resource person: Ask the participants to design the sling shot on their own, when you introduce the challenges. Only if a team is struggling, give them clue to design it as shown below. The cut they make on the balloon must be small enough to hold the paper cup tight, when the balloon is pulled back to shoot)

Challenge 3: Paper Bridge (Jesus is the Way, the Path and life of every Christian): Teams must make a bridge using an A4 plane paper to balance a big paper cup / Toy on top of the two vertically placed books.

(Note to the resource person: Students just need to fold the paper to make it stronger. If you have not done this before, please watch the link given below.

Challenge 4: Wall of Jericho (Jesus can remove your obstacles for you): A paper cup pyramid or Wall of Jericho is built by each team with 55 paper cups, starting with a base of 10 cups. One team member from each team runs towards the table from the far end of the room. When they reach the table, they inflate the balloon and using the air from the balloon to destroy the wall of Jericho. They must not tie the balloons, but they must blow it down from the same distance, drawn on the floor with the chalk/ tape. As soon as the air in the balloon is finished that team member goes back and another team member repeats the same action as a relay race until all team members gets a chance or all paper cups falls. The team that successfully blows all 55 cups down first, wins the challenge. (None of the cups must be standing up)





MESSAGE & CONCLUSION

Ask students to identify any stories from the Bible that can be related to the challenges they performed.

Challenge 1 can be related to Peter walking on water. Now pour a drop of dish washing fluid into the water and show the participants how the paper clip sinks to the bottom of the bowl. Explain that if we have Grace of God anything is possible for us. When Peter doubted God, he began to sink. In our case through sin we lose the Grace. So, reconciliation is necessary to bring back the broken relationship to God. When we reconcile with God the Spirit empowers us.

Challenge 2 was about David and Goliath. Talk about how God chose a shepherd boy to kill the mighty Goliath and made him capable to rule over Israel, the chosen people of God. Stress the point that God does not choose the able but makes the chosen capable. Mention the examples of Disciples and St. Joseph of Cupertino. Holy Spirit empowers the people even if they are weak and powerless and change them to do the will of God.



Challenge 3 can be related to God dividing the red sea for the Israelites to pass through. At a time when they thought, it was all going to end, no promised land.... and death by Pharaoh's army's sword, God through Moses does the impossible. So, when we feel down and lose hope, we should learn to trust back in God's promises for us: I have a plan for you...Spirit of God makes you stronger...

Challenge 4 can be related to Joshua breaking the wall of Jericho. Ask them how would you react if they were told that your paper-cup "walls" would collapse if you would simply march around your table and make some noises by bursting your balloons and shouting very loudly? Why would you react in this way? How did the Israelites bring down the walls of Jericho? How do you think this was possible?

God had promised to give the land of Canaan to the Israelites. In Joshua's story, we read about how God fulfilled the first instalment of this promise at Jericho. When God makes a promise, we can trust him to fulfil it. And when God tells us to do something, we must trust him rather than question his wisdom. Have you ever felt that obeying the Word of God felt strange or counter-cultural? Tell us more. How does the story of Jericho help us deal with this issue?

Conclude

God loves us and wants the best for us. God promises to bless us and be with us if we love and honour him. Sometimes this feels strange or difficult, but we must continue to trust and obey God, even if we do not see God at work or experience his blessings immediately.

- 5 things you can see: For example, your phone, a window, a glass of water, etc.
- 4 things you can feel: Consider the texture of your clothes, the chair you're sitting on, the temperature, etc.
- 3 things you can hear: Listen for sounds far away as well as in the same room.
- 2 things you can smell: Notice the scent in the air, or maybe the smell of your hands or a nearby object.
- 1 thing you can taste: Maybe your coffee or tea, or simply the taste in your mouth.

As you notice and name the things you can sense, thank God for them. Acknowledge that each detail is something that He has given to you.

MESSAGE

Gratitude Is a State of Mind. Count God's blessing every day. Have a state of mind of gratitude. Gratitude means thanks and appreciation. ... Gratitude, which rhymes with "attitude," comes from the Latin word gratus, which means "thankful, pleasing." When you feel gratitude, you're pleased by what someone did for you and also pleased by the results. Unlike indebtedness, you're not anxious about having to pay it back.

HOW TO CONDUCT THE ACTIVITY/ RULES:

NOTE: The laptop navigator must not use their mouse or the space bar to move between slides. Use the icons.

Icons to know:

- Home icon Takes you to the Cash board once a question has been answered.
- ? Takes you to the answer slide.
- Star Takes you from the answer slide to the Money Won slide. Hit the star once a question has been answered correctly to show the money that has been won.
- 50/50 Takes away two answers.
- Phone a friend Takes you to a slide with a timer. Click your mouse once to activate the timer.
- 1 With a total of 1 million dollars available per round (4 million total), the group will nominate one individual at a time to answer at least one question in each round of the game.

Each round has 15 questions, 60 total across the 4 rounds.

The game show host will tell the participants that you can only use a lifeline twice in one round. You can use up to 2 lifelines for one question.

2 The laptop navigator needs to pay close attention to what the gameshow host and the participant are saying to successfully navigate the PowerPoint and allow for lifelines.



3 The timekeeper will start a 20 second timer, and within this time, the nominated individual in the hot seat must respond. The timer can stop temporarily to allow time for one of the lifelines – 50/50, phone a friend, or ask the audience.

If you cannot use the excel spreadsheet available for the 'Ask the audience' option, ask students to raise their hands and take a count. When phone a friend is selected, the host will repeat the question for the friend, as it is not available on screen.

4 This process goes on until each round is complete. If an answer is responded to incorrectly, the participant is booted off the seat, and a new participant must take their place.

Try to make sure each student gets a chance to answer at least one question across the 4 rounds. Set a maximum number of questions that can be answered by one student before they are asked to move on and nominate a person to take their seat.
