- Thomas became the first apostle to explicitly acknowledge Jesus' divinity crying "My Lord and my God."









The Syro-Malabar Eparchy of St Thomas the Apostle, Melbourne





Ice Breaker - Pass the Parcel

Materials Required:

♦ Paper wrapped package, gift, music

Rules:

- Wrap the prize in multiple layers of paper.
- On each paper write a funny action or activity
- Children to sit in a circle and pass the package when the music starts

- The person who has the package when the music stops must remove one layer of paper and do the action or activity.

 There are mainly two categories of virtues: Theological virtues and Cardinal virtues.

Theological virtues

- Why are they called theological virtues?
- Because they come from God and lead to God.

Cardinal virtues

 The cardinal virtues are human virtues, acquired by actually doing them, gained from education and good actions.

Faith, hope, charity/love

Faith



Faith is when we have confidence or trust in God.

Our faith is shown when saying the prayers and partaking in the traditions of the Church.

Hope



Hope is the confidence that God will hear our prayers and provide for us according to his will.

Charity/love



Charity/love is seeing God in those around you and always being ready to help especially towards the needy and suffering.

Activity

Virtue Jar Game

Materials Required:

3 mason jars with labels of faith, hope and charity (for each group)

Paddle pop sticks with Faith, Hope, and Charity prompts x 30 (10 per group)

Rules:

Divide the class into 3 groups

The first player in a team picks a clothespin out of the bag and reads what is written on it out loud.

Team members then discuss which jar it should go into (either Faith, Hope or Charity).

Player places it into the appropriate jar

The first team to place all 10 paddle pops in the correct jar wins







Clothespin Drop Game

Example prompts:

- Saying bedtime prayers (Act of Faith)
- Believing that God is all powerful (Act of Faith)
- Reading the Bible to learn about Jesus' life (Act of Faith)
- Learning about God by going to Qurbana (Act of Faith)
- Desiring forgiveness when you do something wrong (Act of Hope)
- Trusting that if you lose your entire house God will take care of you (Act of Hope)
- Trusting that God will heal you when you are sick (Act of Hope and Faith)
- Longing to be in heaven with God when you die (Act of Hope and Faith)
- Smiling at someone on the bus who is grumpy (Act of Charity)
- Using your allowance to buy a Christmas gift for the poor (Act of Charity)
- Giving canned food to the food shelter (Act of Charity)
- Putting your dirty dishes in the dishwasher (Act of Charity)

Through this activity, the children not only understand how to perform these 3 virtues in their daily life through the example prompts but by separating the virtues into the 3 jars they are able to comprehend their differences.





Love/Charity/Caritas

Today, we focus to learn on the virtue of Love, The greatest commandment of Jesus!

Caritas:

- Caritas is a Latin word meaning "love".
- "And now faith, hope and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love" (1 Cor 13:13)




Charity/ Love leads us to God. It is up to us to decide whether or not we want to accept and use them.




Theme presentation: Charity/Caritas

Theme presentation: Charity/Caritas

- Our acts should rely on God in prayer in order that it be the authentic acts of charity






Charity is an authentic love!

Authentic Love:


- 1. Recognize God's love for you and all of His creation.
- Reflect that love back into the world. It is to honour everyone and everything as God does.



Crucified Jesus is the perfect example of this authentic love. Whenever we have any questions about how to act in charity, all we need to do is look at the cross. Jesus put our ultimate well-being ahead of his own, and suffered so that we might be saved from our own sins.

Charity & Ten Commandments

What is Holy Qurbana?

It is the real repetition of our Lord's sacrifice at calvary. It was his greatest act of Love for us!

During the last supper when Jesus asks us to "Do this in memory of me", this song remind us our Lord's command to celebrate this sacrament and also to bring together or restore the friendship. Jesus was not only asking us to participate in the Qurbana but also asking us to break ourselves for others for the love of Christ. This should happen in our everyday life where we try to live the Qurbana. We should offer ourselves as a sacrifice to Jesus by doing something that you don't like to do but do it happily for the love of Christ, sacrifice something for someone else without complaints.





Scenario:

Boy: "Jesus has come and abolished the Old Testament. Therefore, there is no need to follow the Ten Commandments. All what we need to do is just to love." How do you respond and why?

Does Charity/Love abolish the Ten Commandments?

No; it gives new meaning to them.

Charity and Commandments

Charity, or love, is the virtue that allows us to fulfil the two greatest commandments revealed by Jesus.

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbour as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments," (Matthew 22:37-40, Mark 12:29-31).







Charity keeps the commandments of God and his Christ: "Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love." (John 15: 9-12)

We are called to follow ten commandments because we love God above all things, and we love others as ourselves.

Charity is the highest virtue. Why?

Because all other virtues are driven by charity (either towards God or towards your neighbour). Hope and faith are at the service of charity. These virtues lead to charity. Without hope and faith, we cannot love God and love others. We become better people through virtue so that we can become people of love.

The Apostle Paul has given an incomparable depiction of charity:

"Charity is patient and kind; charity is not jealous or boastful; it is not arrogant or rude. Charity does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrong but rejoices in the right".

Charity bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

"If I . . . have not charity," says the Apostle, "I am nothing." Whatever my privilege, service, or even virtue, "if I . . . have not charity, I gain nothing."

Charity is superior to all the virtues.

It is the first of the theological virtues: "So faith, hope, charity abide, these three.

But the greatest of these is charity."





Activity

10 Commandments on Cross

Instruction for teachers: Need to use scissor for this activity to cut the paper, teachers need to be vigilant, may cut the paper for them.


Materials Required: Candy hearts/Heart cut outs, The ten commandments color print out - 10 commandments.docx, Cross template, black chart paper, Glue, scissors, Magnetic tape (optional), Ribbon (optional)

Preparation:

- 1. Print out the cross template
- 2. Cut out the crosses
- 3. Poke a hole in the top of the cross and attach the ribbon first. (If making as a hanging ornament)
- 4. Scatter a generous amount of candy hearts on the table. (Hearts should have ten commandments printed on them. Each student can choose seven hearts for their craft)

To do:

- Children will select hearts and glue them to the front of their foam cross.
- Tell the children to read the hearts carefully and select the ones they say how much they love Jesus following the commandment, Jesus died on the cross for our sins.
- Children need to glue all 10 commandments on the cross attaching them to the heart shapes.






Activity

10 Commandments on Cross - Message

- The cross remind us of how much God loves us. He loved us so much that sent His Son as a sacrifice for our sins.
- He wants each of us to be close to Him, and that means you, too. He wants you to know Him and believe in Who He is.
- We can show our love for Jesus by obeying, keeping God's commandments and loving people as you would want them to love you.
- Every commandments point to God and towards our love to our brothers and sisters.

Theme Presentation - Loving God

God loves us.

Pope Benedict XVI reminds us that "everything has its origin in God's love, everything is shaped by it, everything is directed towards it. Love is God's greatest gift to humanity; it is His promise and our hope"



Do you love God? Certainly, you do!

First three Commandments: it's all about loving God!

- I am the LORD your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me.
- You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.
- Remember to keep holy the LORD'S Day.

God is our priority, if we love God with all our hearts, souls, minds and strength then we don't give priority to other things, Love God is to obey God, when we love God, we will want to please God and obey His commandments, making God the centre of our lives.



Explanation of Commandment to kids


- 1. God is more important than anyone or anything else
- 2. We must put God first in our lives.
 - God loves us deeply, and so we should love Him with all our hearts.
 - The Bible gives many examples of young people who loved God.
 - For example, as a young boy, Samuel worked hard at God's tabernacle.
 - When God called, he answered, "Speak, for Your servant hears."
 - We can ask students to make a list of what special things they have in their rooms that show who they are.
 - Do you have a sports poster? A picture of a family member?
 - A statue of a dancer? Where is God?
 - Suggest they find a spot for God in their room and observe the first Commandment by honouring the creator who gave us life and this wonderful world.
- > How would you feel if someone said bad things and said swears around your mom or your dad?
- > How do you think God feels when he hears those kinds of words coming from your mouth?
- Do you swear to fit in with your friends? How can you remember to think before you speak?







Explanation of Commandment to kids



- We have no right to use it carelessly or to use it to curse other people.
- Jesus even said, "Do not swear at all". How many hours do you spend in school?
- How much time do you watch television or play video games? What makes a day special?
- Why is Sunday special? God rested on the seventh day, and He wants us to rest too.
- It is a day to focus on God, on His beautiful creation and on our families.

1. We can love God by Adoration

For teachers'note

Adoration:

- Adoration is a form of prayer, is the summary of all virtues,
- ♦ Is the act of worship to God only who is our creator with bodily signs of humility.
- ♦ Eucharistic adoration :which involves the worship of Eucharist with deep love and respect.
- ♦ We adore God who is almighty, loving and full of mercy.
- Adore God present to us in the Eucharist: adoring and worshiping the real presence of Christ in the blessed sacrament.
 - We recognize our nothingness before God, heart and soul of humility.
 - > We are weak, and, without God, we are nothing. Our pride can make this hard to admit.
 - > But when we can recognize this, adoration then enables us to offer all glory to God rather than ourselves.
 - > It enables us to bow down before Him in love and worship as we offer all the praise and glory to Him.



2. We can love God by Prayer





Adoration + thanksgiving+ petition+ sacrifice= Prayer

- We are called to "pray always."
- A By making God the centre of our lives, we choose also to make prayer the centre of our lives.
- Prayer is the active way in which we unite ourselves to God,
- Make God the centre of our lives.

3. We can love God by Sacrifices

Sacrifice:

Sacrifice is giving up something you love for someone you love even more.





3. We can love God by Sacrifices

The sacrifice of Jesus on the cross at Calvary which is the perfect expression of His love for us, Perfect example of sacrifice.

Sacrifice is at the heart of the love of Jesus in that He willingly gave His life on the Cross for our sins.

Why do children have to make sacrifices?

Making sacrifices and having a giving heart is one way to worship God. E.g., not having meat or chocolate during lent.

Help parents when everyone else watch T.V or cartoons or playing games.

We may have to make sacrifices in our lives in order to help others.

Sacrifice must be seen as a wonderful opportunity to put God and His will first in our lives.

To live a sacrificial life is nothing other than to make the will of God more important than anything else in our lives.

The fruit of sacrifice is spiritual joy and peace.





Musical Balloons

Instruction for teachers: Need to use scissor for this activity to cut the paper, teachers need to be vigilant, may need to cut the paper for them.

Materials Required: Balloons, Pictures of small sacrifice activities /Sacrifice lists in strips of paper, Scissor, Glue

Preparation:

- Inflate balloons
- 2. Glue the sacrifice activities on balloons

To do:

- Let all children to stand in groups.
- Play music and have each child grab a balloon when the music starts have kids bounce their balloons in the air and move to the music.
- When the music stops, they have to freeze and whoever is holding a balloon "wins."
- Child who is not holding the balloon has to pick one from the floor and read the sacrifice activity on the balloon
 and explain how this sacrifice is a way to worship God.
- Continue the game until everyone gets a chance to read and explain one sacrifice activity.

Scenario 2




Origami is the Japanese art of folding paper. Follow the steps to make a folded paper heart!



Start with a square piece of paper. Fold it in half to make a triangle, then open it back up.




Now fold the other side to make a triangle. Open it back up so you have two creases on your square.



Fold the top point to meet the crease in the center.






Fold the bottom point to meet the top.





Who is the Apostle Thomas?

- One of the 12 Apostles of Jesus
- His character is outlined in The Gospel of John.
- St. Thomas came to India and evangelized it between 52 and 72 AD during his missionary journeys in India.
- He was martyred on July 3rd 72 AD at Madras. We celebrate his martyrdom as the feast of Dukhrana
- Thomas became the first apostle to explicitly acknowledge Jesus' divinity crying "My Lord and my God."



On 23 December 2013 Holy Father Francis established The Syro-Malabar Eparchy of St Thomas the Apostle, Melbourne for Australia, Bishop Bosco Puthur, as the first Bishop/Eparch of the new Eparchy. On January 2023, Pope Francis appointed Bishop John Panamthottathil as the second bishop of the Syro-Malabar Eparchy at Thomas the Apostle in Melbourne.

Duration: 25 Minutes

Materials Required: Pictures of Syro-Malabar saints cut down as puzzles. A short description of their life

Preparations For The Activity: Separate people into same sized teams. Give each a different saint's jigsaw puzzle (with equal difficulty & number of pieces). Each group has the same amount of time to complete the puzzle.


How To Conduct The Activity / Rules Etc: Each group is given the same amount of time to complete the puzzle. The secret twist is to switch up a few pieces with the other groups beforehand! The goal is to finish before the others - so they must figure out collectively how to convince other teams to give up pieces they need. This can be through barter, merging or changing teams.

Once the activity is completed one of the team members will read out the script provided on the saint's life.

Intention of this game: It intended to familiarise the students with Syro-Malabar Saints and their names





How to prepare Pesaha Appam and Paal

Kalthappam

Ingredients

2 cups of raw rice 3/4 urudal 15 shallots Cup of coconut pieces

Instructions:

Soak raw rice & Urudal for 3 hours then grind it together. Cut shallots in small pieces and saute in oil. Saute coconut pieces in oil. Add together to the raw rice & Urudal. Add salt to taste. Leave for an hour. In a pan pour teaspoon of oil and 3 scoops of the mix into the pan. Make a palm into a cross and place it on the top. Cook thoroughly both sides.

Indri Appam

Ingredients

1 1/4 cups rice flour, lightly roasted

½ cup skinless black gram (urad dal or uzhunnu), soaked for 3-4 hours

1 cup grated coconut

1 big shallot

½ tsp cumin seeds

Salt to taste

Water

Instructions:

Place black gram with water in the bowl of a small food processor, and process until a smooth paste forms. Set aside. Place grated coconut, cumin seeds, shallot and enough water in the bowl of the food processor, and process until a very coarse paste forms. Set aside. Place rice flour in a large bowl. Season with salt. Add black gram paste and coconut paste into the bowl. Mix well. Add enough hot water to make lump-free batter. The batter should have idli batter consistency. Set aside for 30 minutes. Grease moulds with oil. Pour the batter in the moulds. Steam for 20-25 minutes.

How to prepare Pesaha Appam and Paal

Paal


Ingredients

2 ½ cups grated jaggery
¼ cup thick coconut milk
1 cup thin coconut milk
¼ tsp ground cumin
A pinch of ground cardamom
2 tsp rice flour

Instructions:

Melt grated jaggery with 2 cups of water. If there are any impurities, strain it. Place the melted jaggery over low heat and add thin coconut milk. Stir constantly for 10 minutes. Add thick coconut milk and stir again for another 10 minutes. Add ground cardamom and ground cumin. Stir continuously for 5 minutes. Add rice flour, and stir constantly, for another 10 minutes, or until it reaches a syrup consistency. Serve pesaha appam with paal.


Syro-Malabar Traditions - Pessaha

Similarities of Jewish Passover and Pesaha of Nasranis

- Cleaning of the household.
- Usage of thoroughly cleaned or new dishes for cooking the Pesaha meal.
- Unleavened bread on the day of Passover.
- > Traces of leavened food or grains are removed.
- > The head of the family serves the food.
- Meals include bitter food or a bitter drink (The Pesaha meal of Nasranis does not include a bitter drink, but on the Passion Friday at the Church, drinking of bitter juice is still observed.)
- Singing of special songs or hymns & later Bible reading.
- Alms-giving to the needy (Passion week is a week of alms-giving for Nasranis needy people)





Extra Activity

Heart Exchange

Materials Required: Love shaped paper hearts in different colours (include four matching hearts), Box, Board with different colours each heart (stick to the board in advance)

Rules: Divide the children into teams. Each team will have hearts placed in different classrooms. Keep the children in two lines. 
Extra Activity

The players must work together to transfer the cups, one at a time, from their starting point to build a pyramid out of cups. The first team to successfully build the pyramid wins. The bottom row must have 7cups, the second row 6 cups, the third row 5 cups, the fourth row 4cups and the fifth row 3cups, sixth row 2 cups and top row must have 1 cup









Objective:







Purity of heart is contained chiefly in three areas:

- charity (Love);
- chastity or sexual correctness;
- love of truth and orthodoxy of faith.





Be resilient through Purity of life

- "Pure in heart refers to those who have attuned their intellects and wills to the demands of God's holiness," chiefly in charity, chastity, and truth.
- Charity means putting God first and acting according to the true good of our neighbour.
- Chastity means living holy purity in terms of sexuality.
- Truth means holding the orthodox faith.

Extra Activity

Clean Heart Craft and Activity

Materials needed: Colour pencils, Heart patterns, A 4 sheets, Glue, good and evil word cards

Steps: Students can be given a heart outline and some good and evil qualities; they should glue the good qualities inside the heart and the bad outside.



Divide students in different groups. Children color the cleaning pictures and heart patterns with colored pencils and glue or staple the heart patterns together to make a pocket. Let students to put good qualities word card inside the heart pocket and evil qualities word card outside. Children read each word on the pictures or word cards. Ask a student to explain what the word means, and then ask him if King Saul displayed this characteristic. Ask him to explain how or in what circumstance King Saul showed this behavior. Ask students if they have ever shown this behavior in their lives. Discuss how they can improve on their behavior with God's help. Have your students place each picture or word card in their hearts after you have discussed each one. Encourage them to use their hearts at home to help them improve their behavior and pray about any bad behavior they have problems changing.

- Draw a large heart shape on a whiteboard.

Jesus Christ was Pure of Heart

- Christ's own perfect purity of heart or singular focus can be seen in His first words recorded in Sacred Scripture. When the twelve-year-old Christ was lost to His parents for three days and they finally found Him in the Temple, He said to them, "How is it that you sought me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" (Lk 2:49)
- The kingdom of God is where God's will is fully done by us and everyone else. Our goal and God's goal for us is full unity with Christ.

What is Purity of Heart?

- Those who are pure in heart are able to see God even in this life. But what does that term mean?
- Purity of heart certainly includes sexual chastity. Clearly, we cannot be pure in heart of we are committing sexual sins, every form of sexual coupling except normal matrimony entered into by two virgins who are faithful to each other for life and whose every intimate act is open to life.
- But purity of heart is more than this. It is actually more akin to right intention or sincerity
- Some people exclude God from their vision of what will make them happy. We can, instead, make our goal in life pleasure, or being admired, or making money, or a thousand other things. If we pursue these things for their own sake in an honorable way, that is, without sinning, we would be acting for a wrong intention in the sense that we would be making a big error. These things will never be able to satisfy us.
